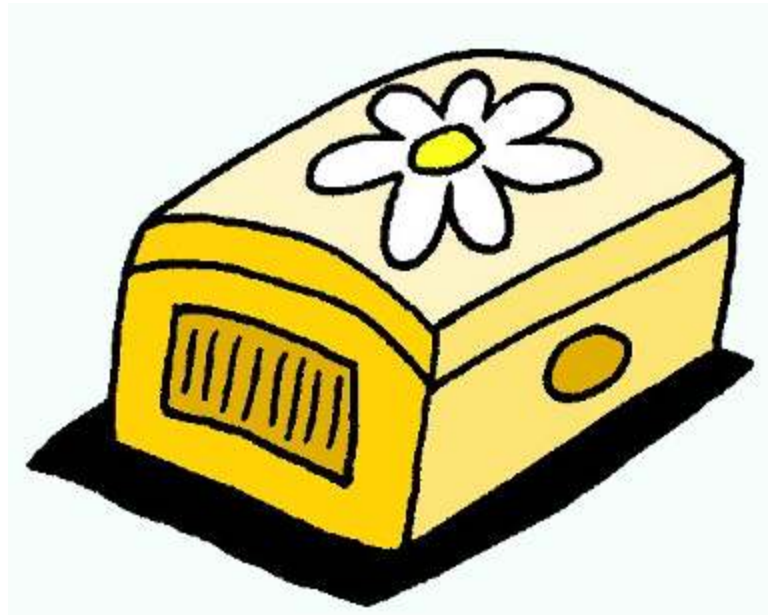


Rose and Daisy

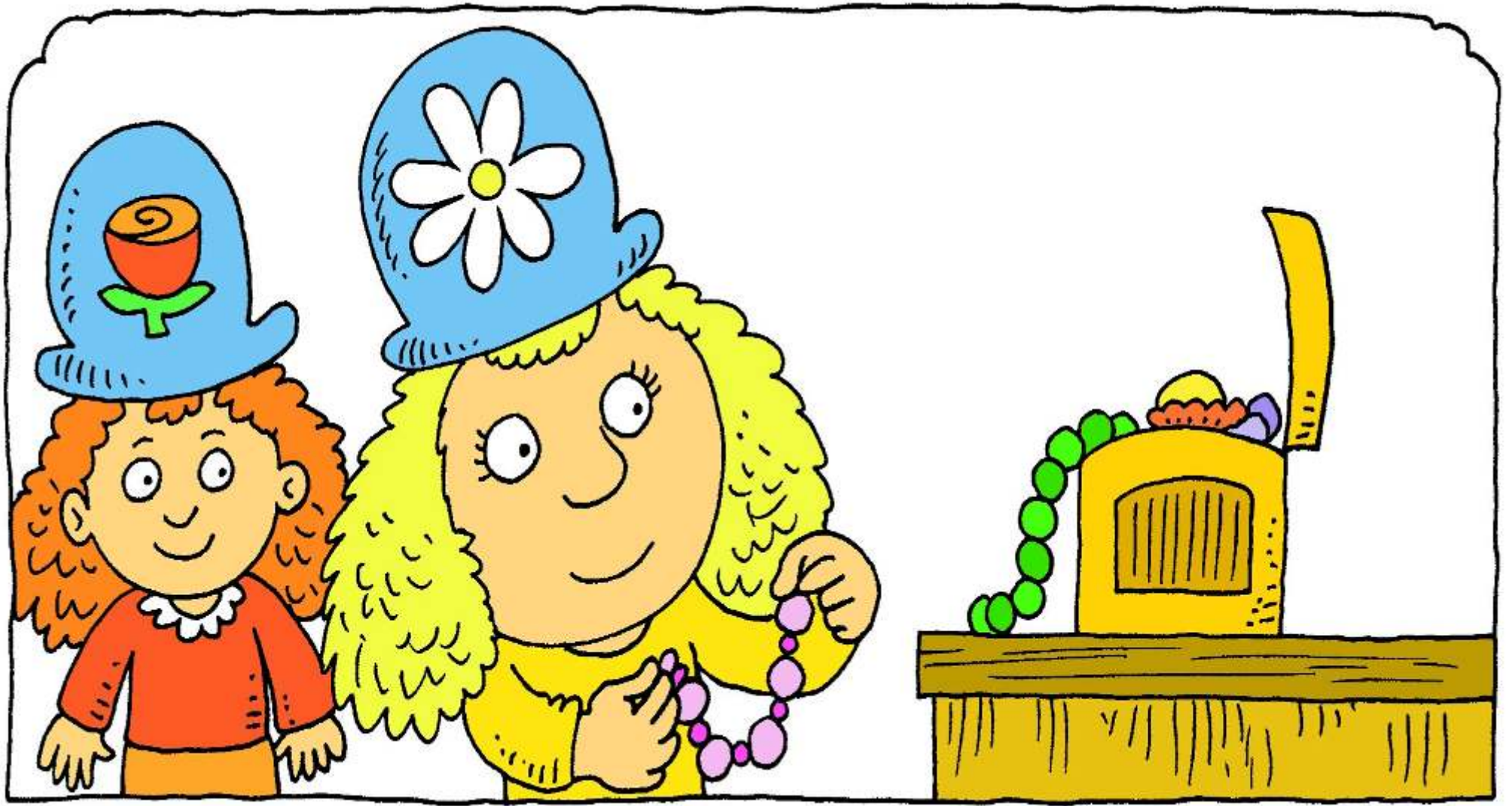

Daisy's house to play.



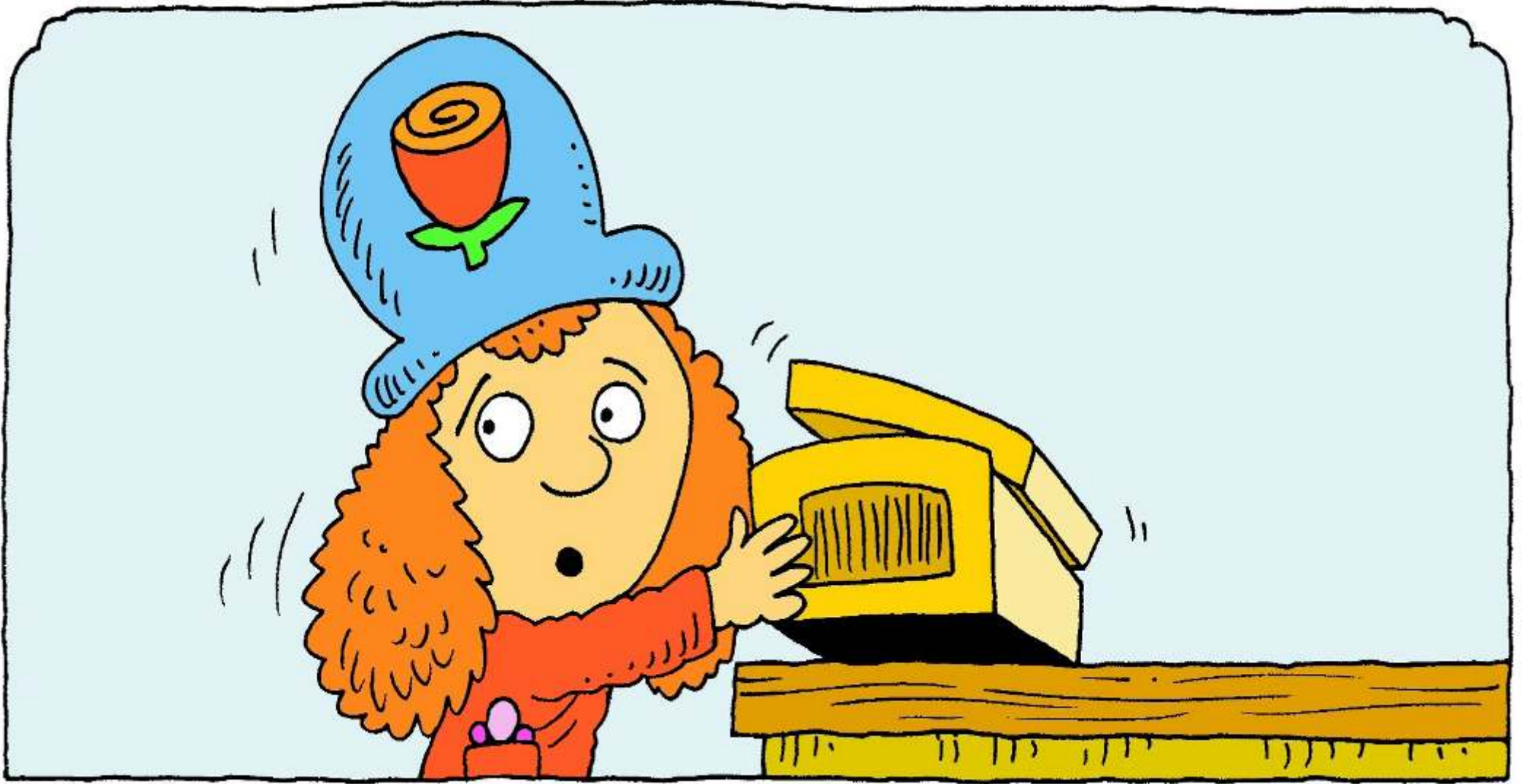
Daisy had a special box of necklaces.

It will be our turn another time.



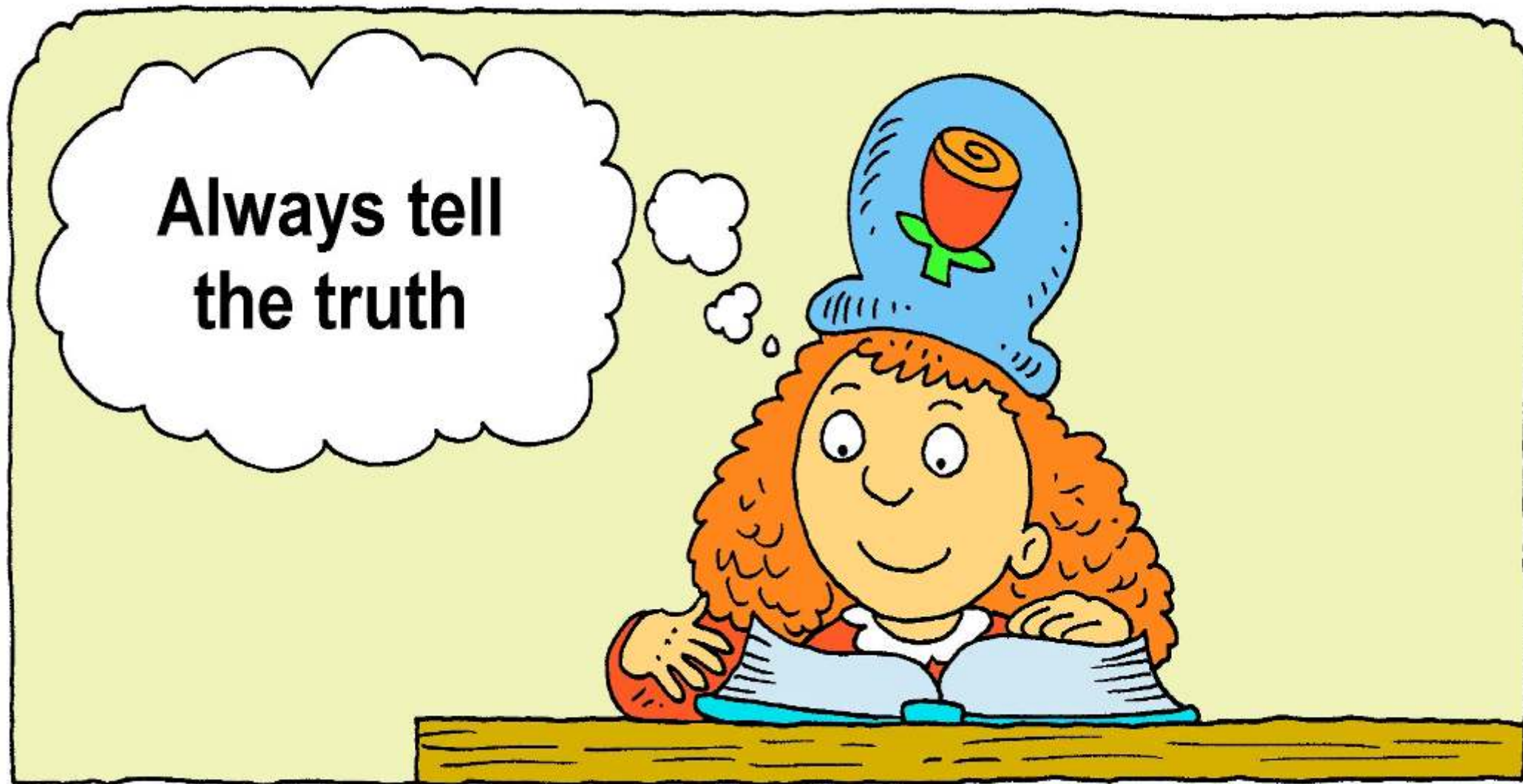
When no one was looking,

She didn't mean to break the box.



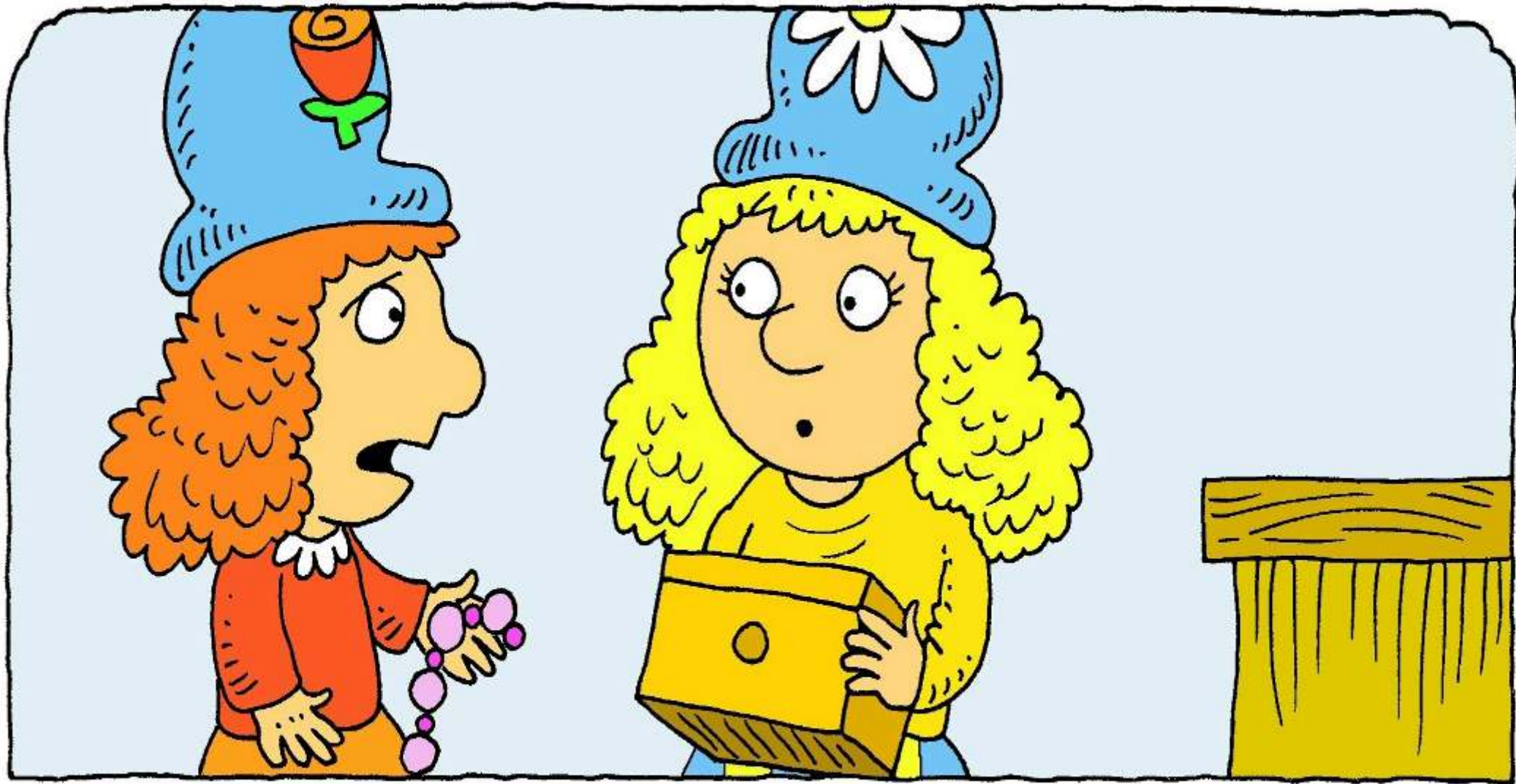
That night Rose remembered
