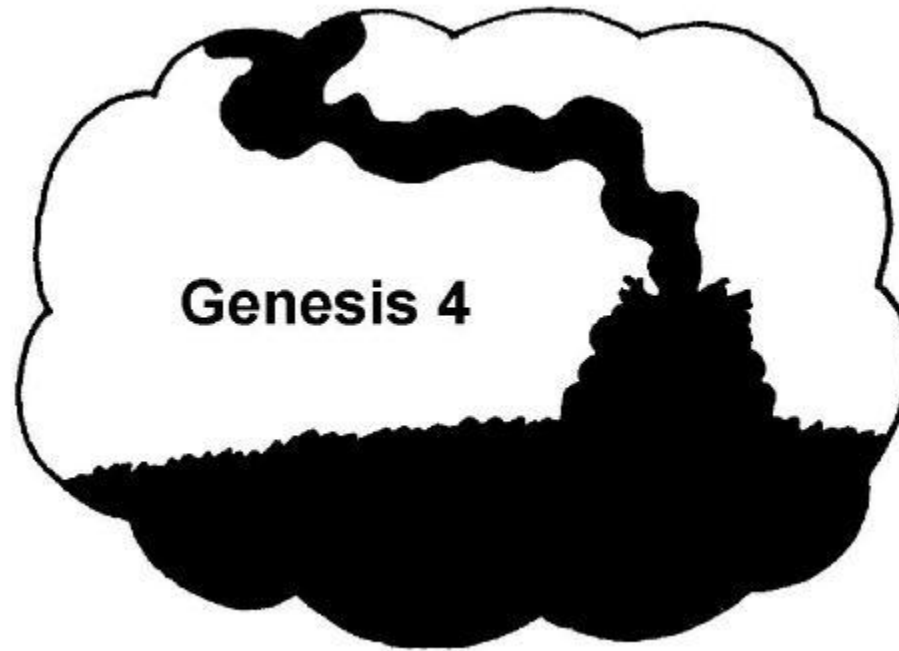
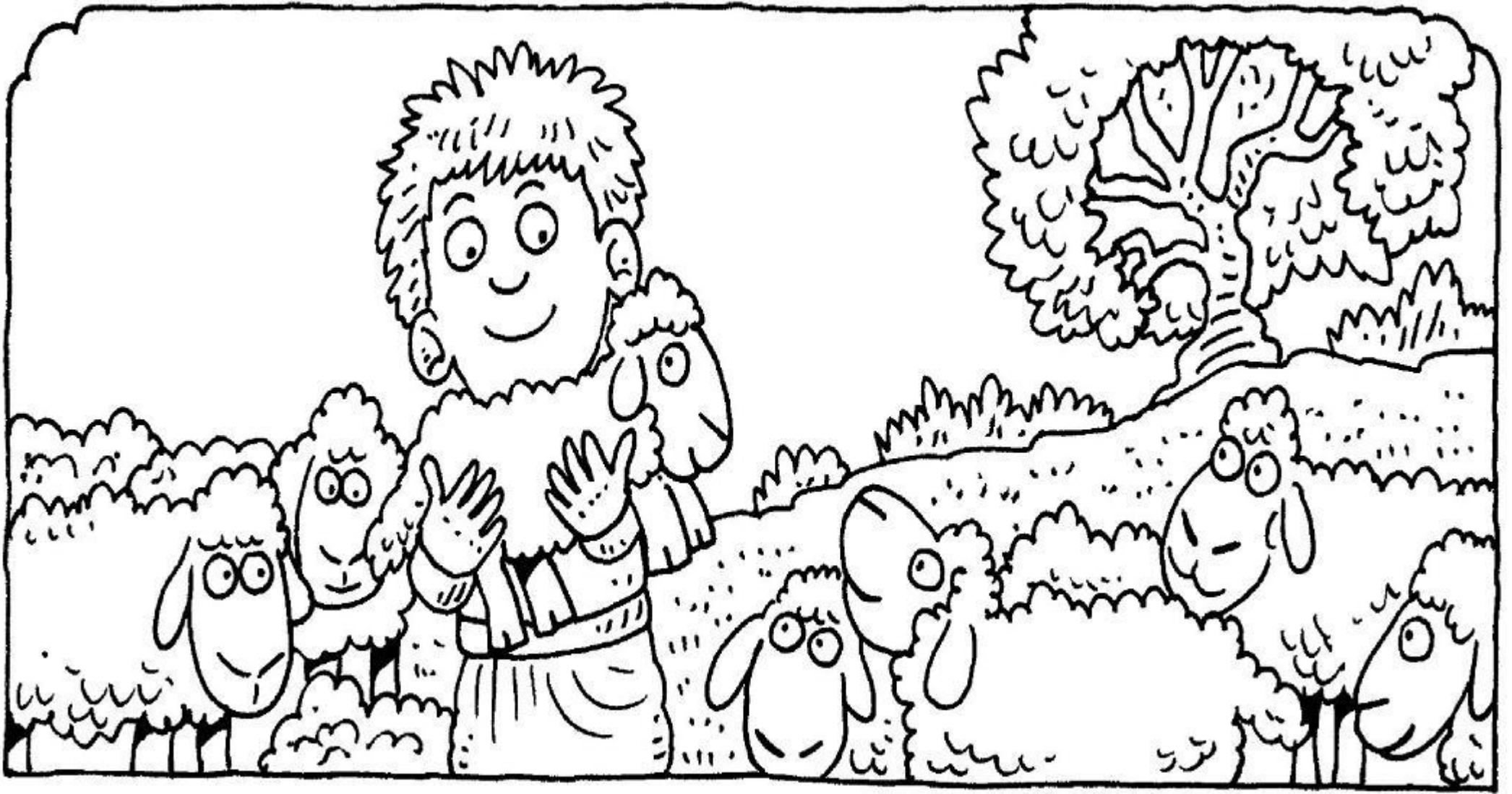


Cain Where Is Your Brother?

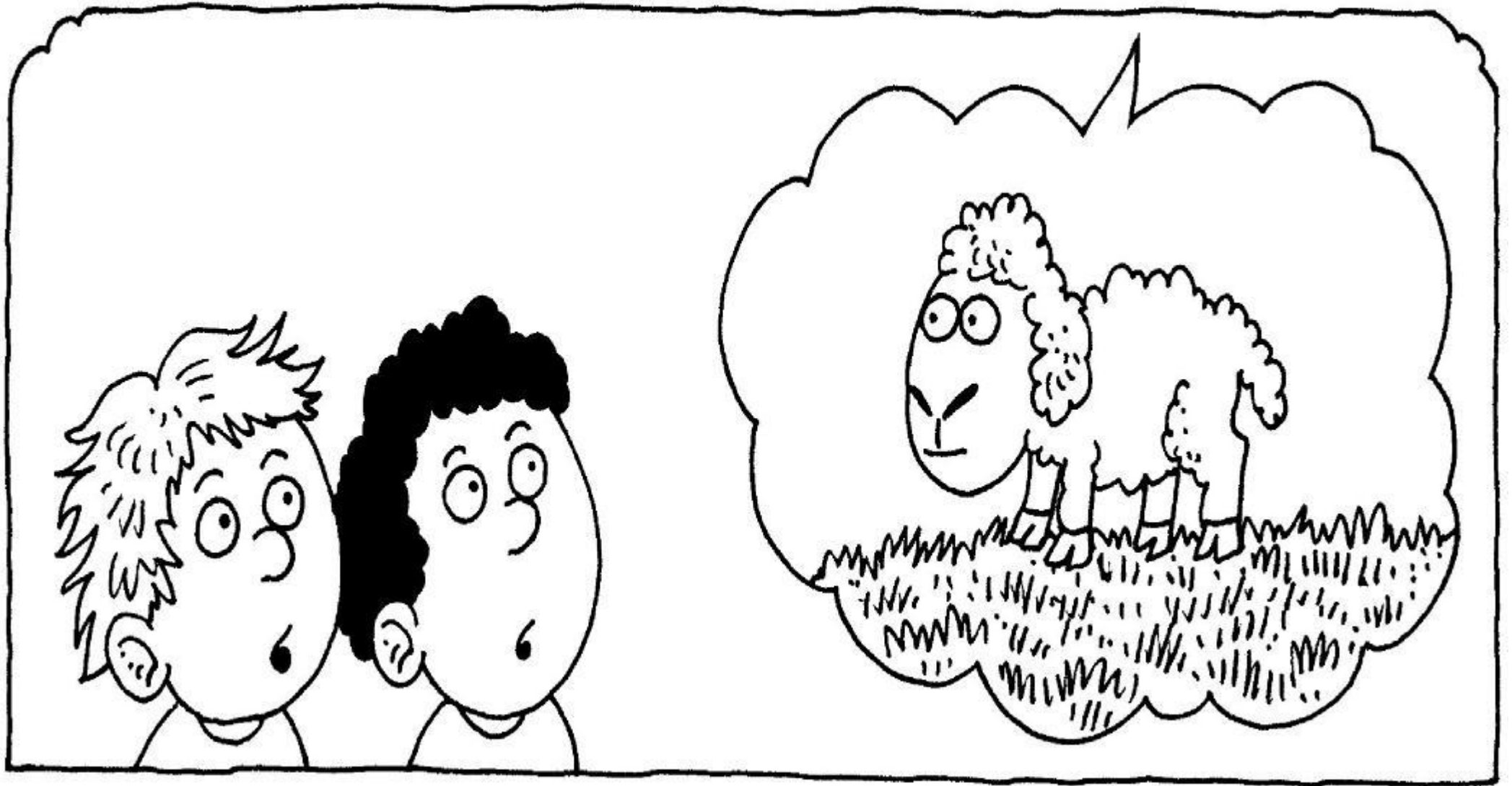

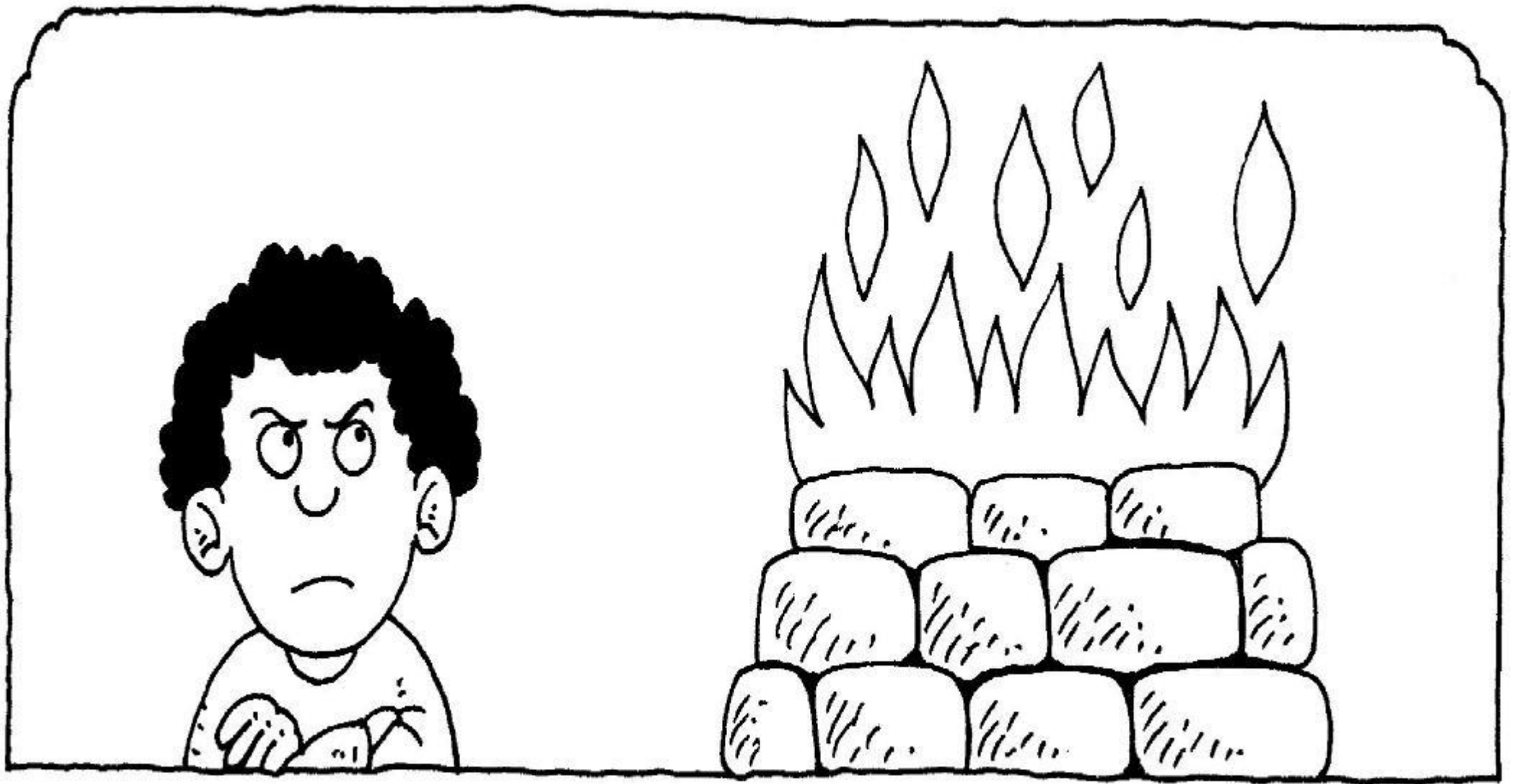




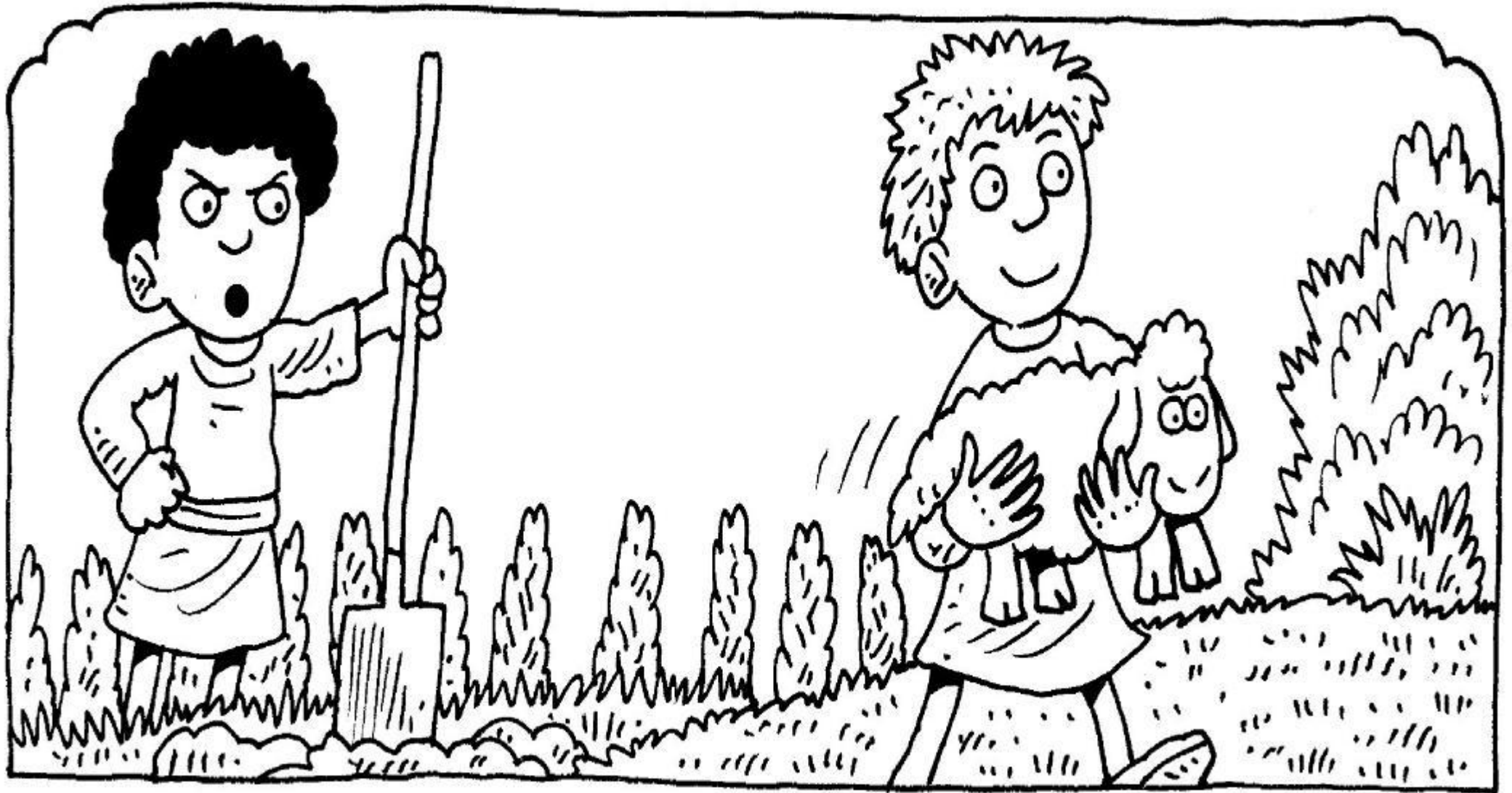
Adam and Eve had two boys.

Cain, the older brother, knew that God had been pleased with his younger brother's gift of a lamb. It made him jealous of his brother.

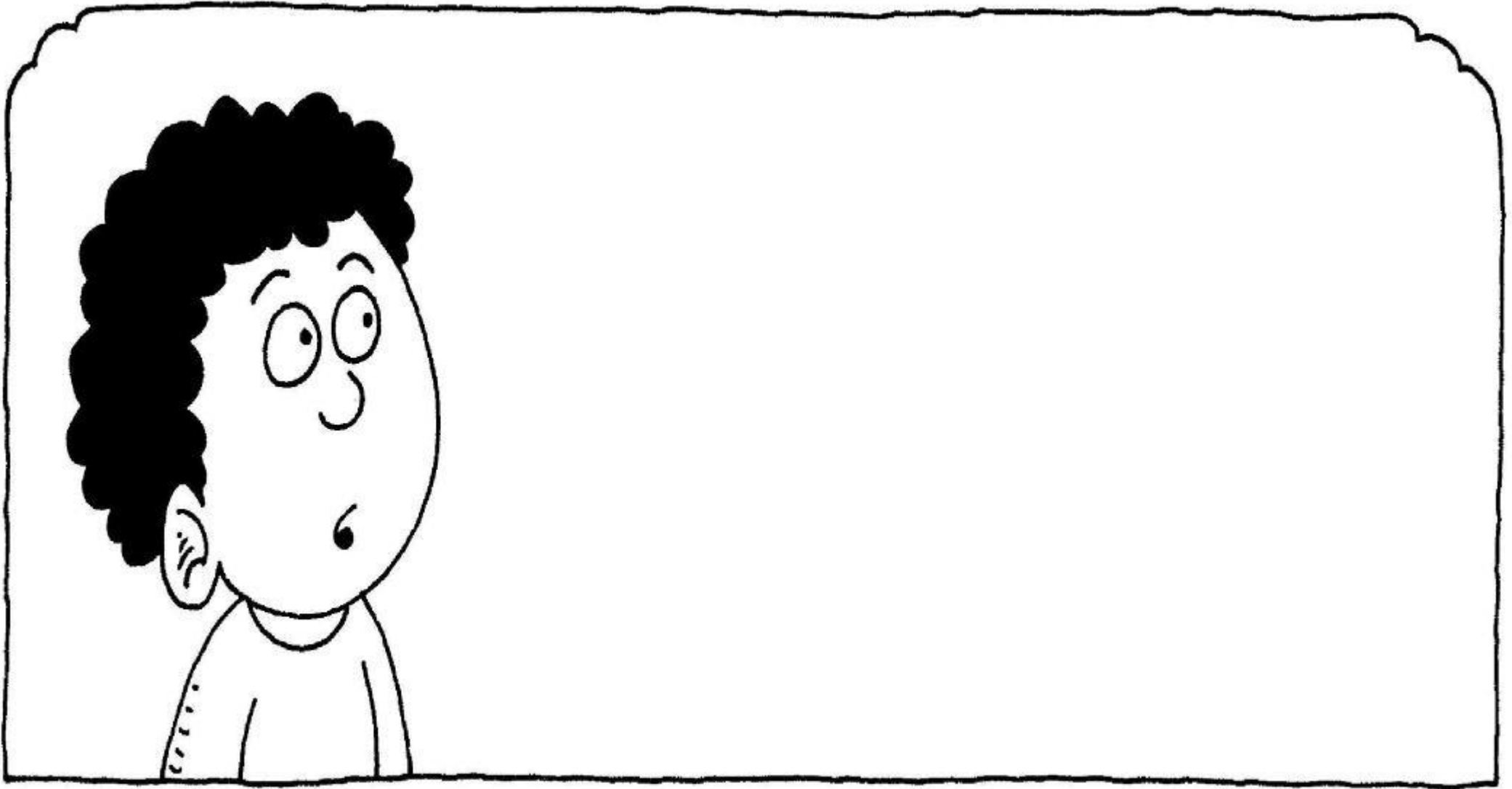


“I work hard and God
should be pleased with me,” he thought.

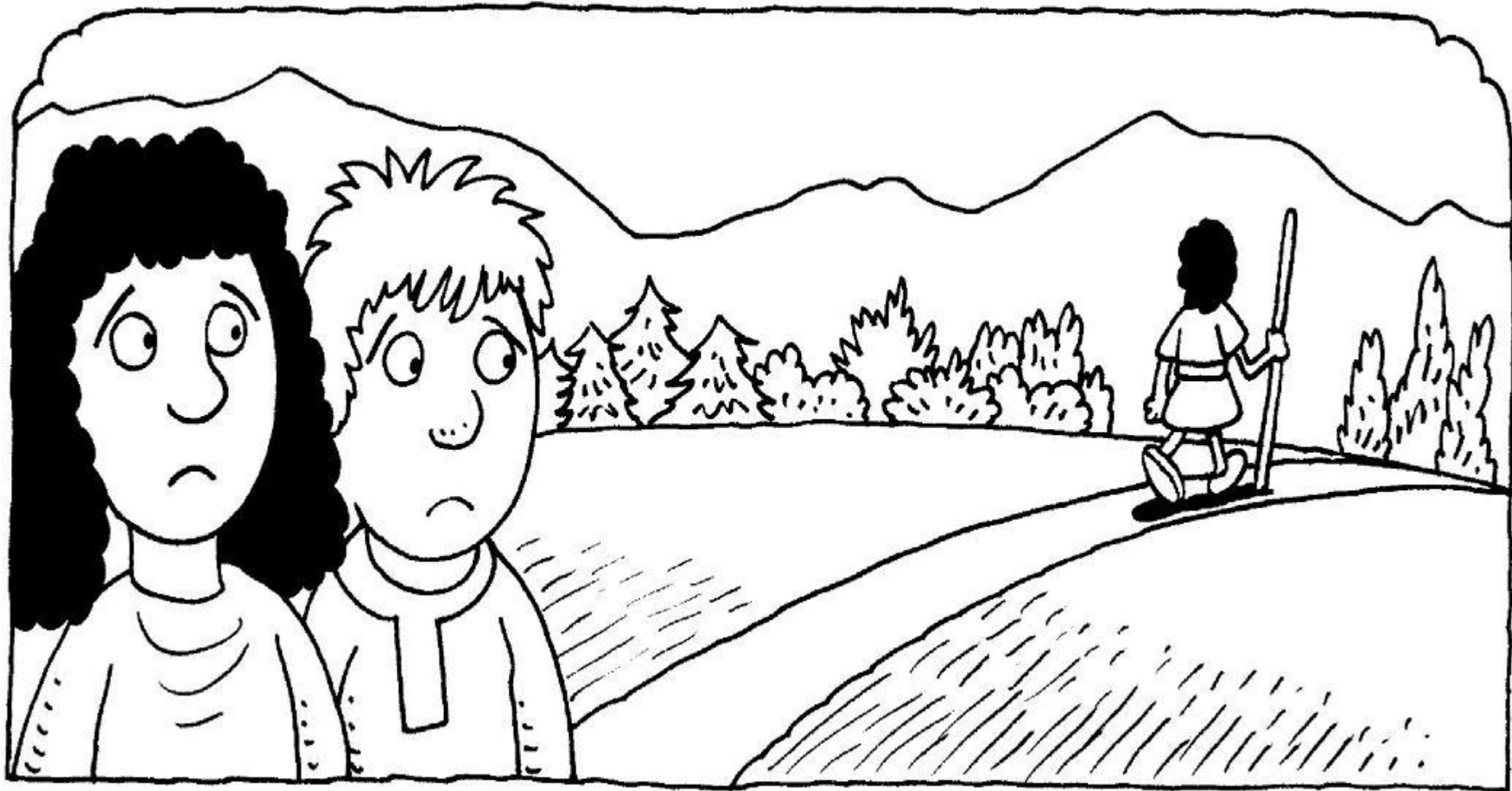
“I am the best.
