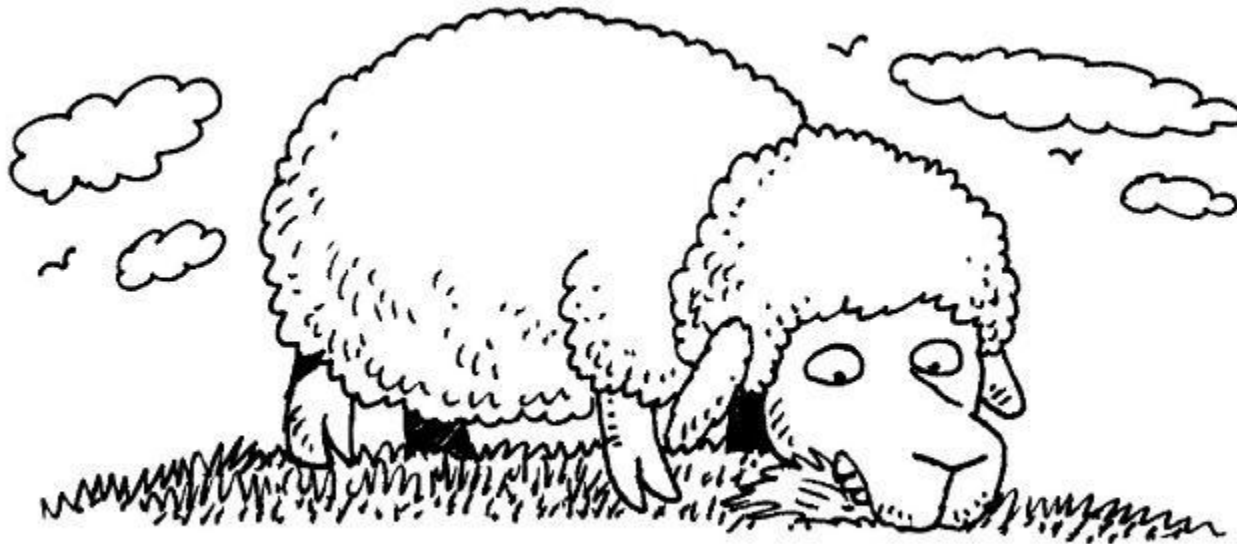


David The Lion And The Bear

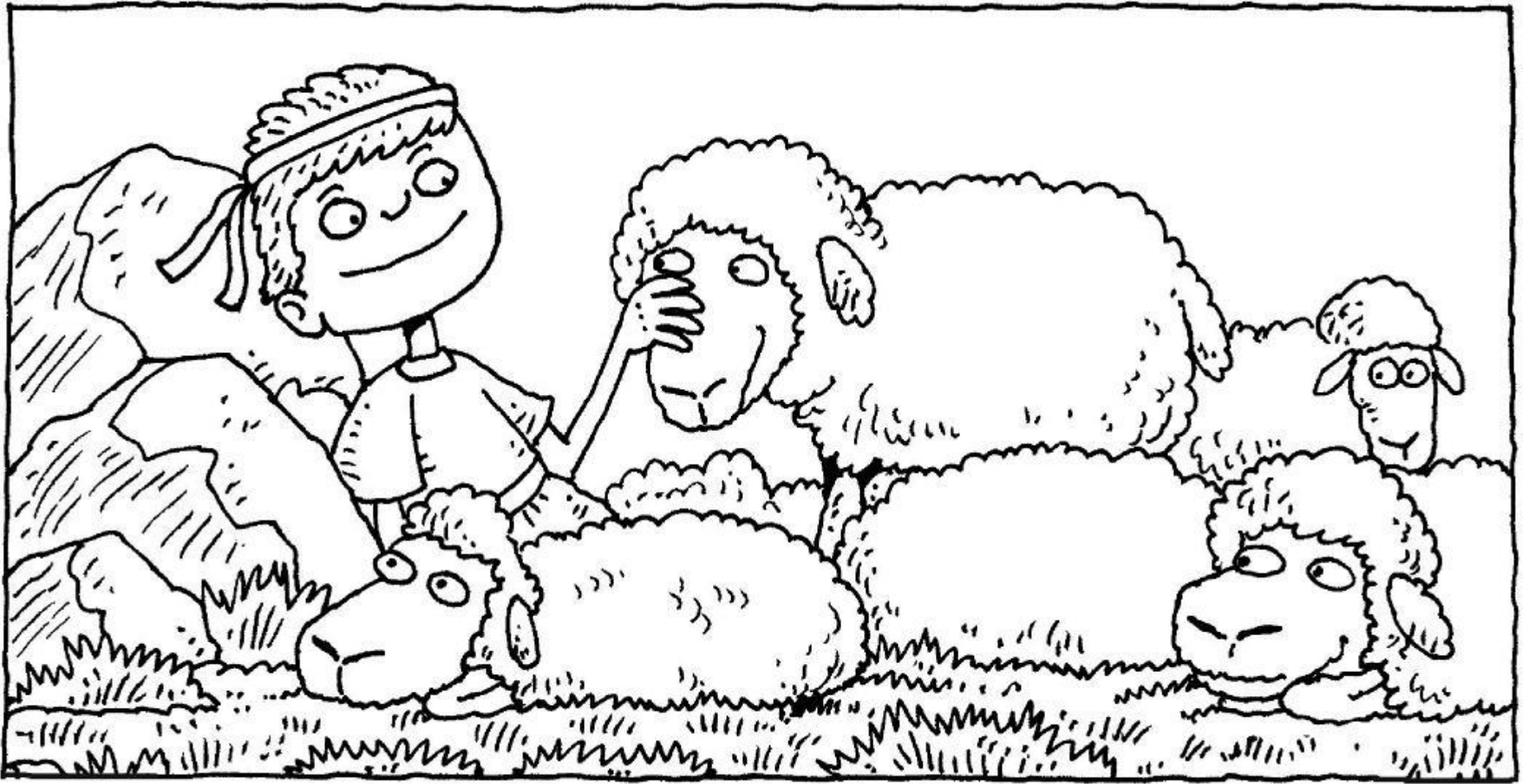

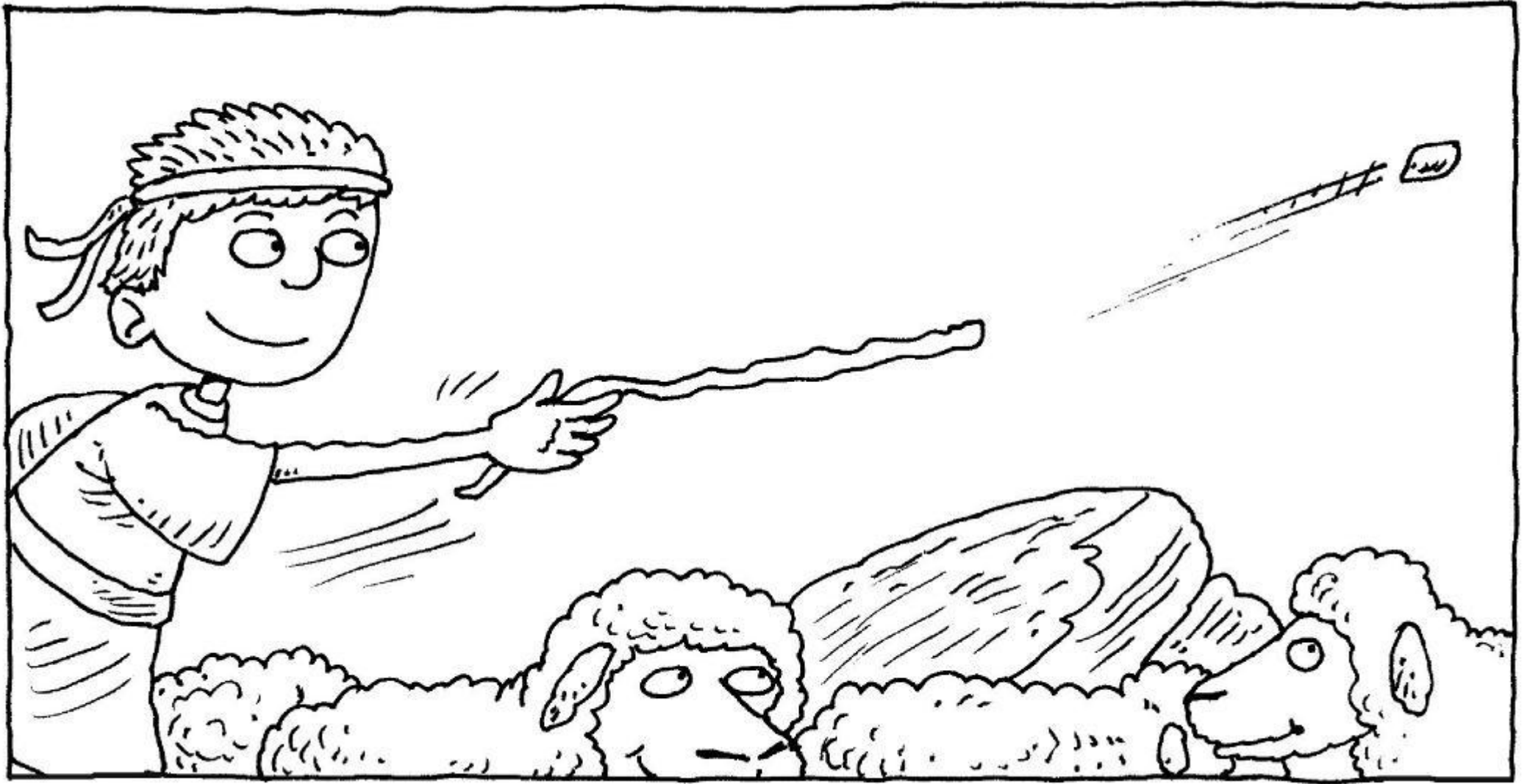

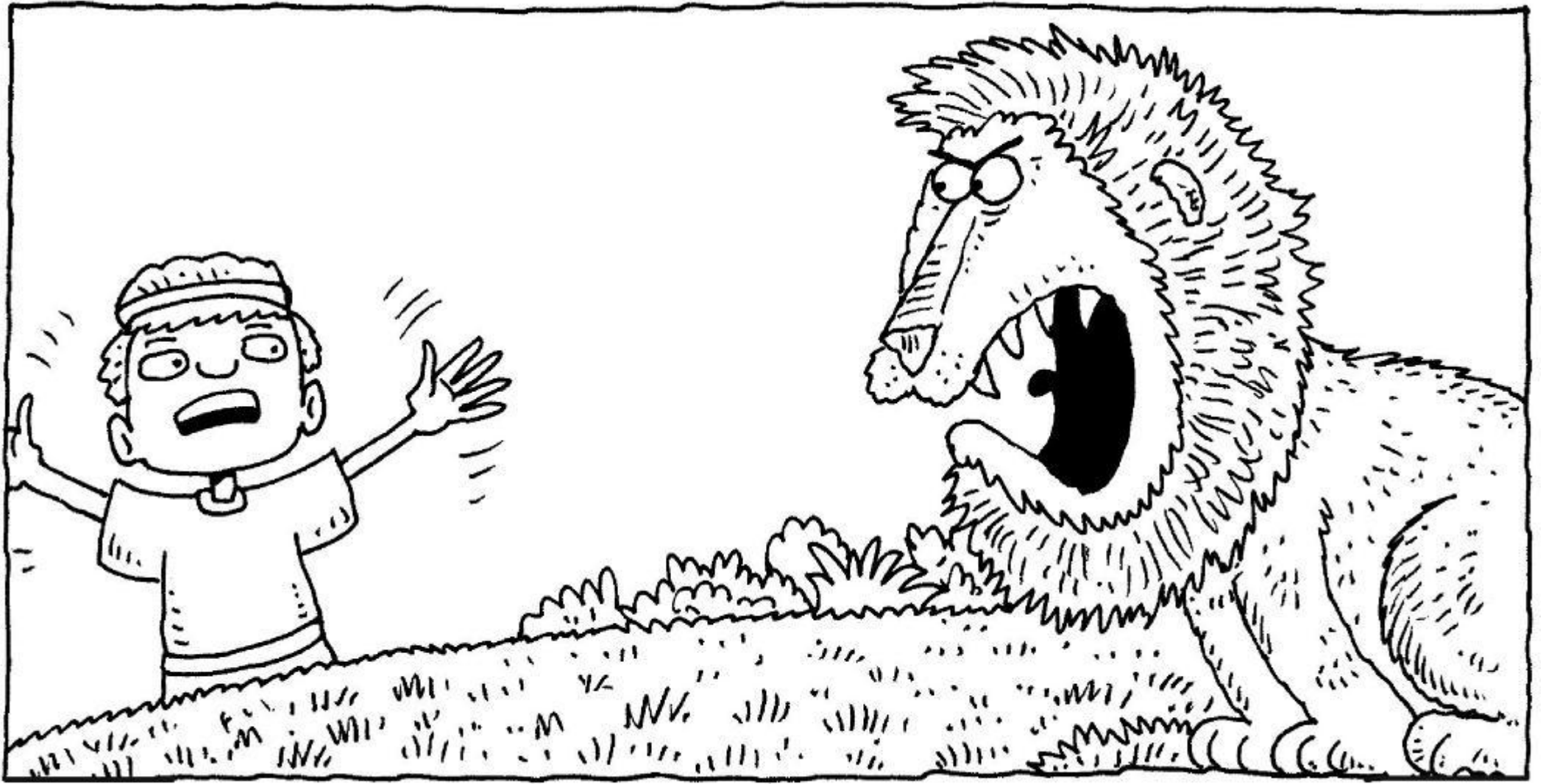
When David was a boy he stayed up on the hills by himself and looked after his father's sheep. He trusted God to keep him and his sheep safe.



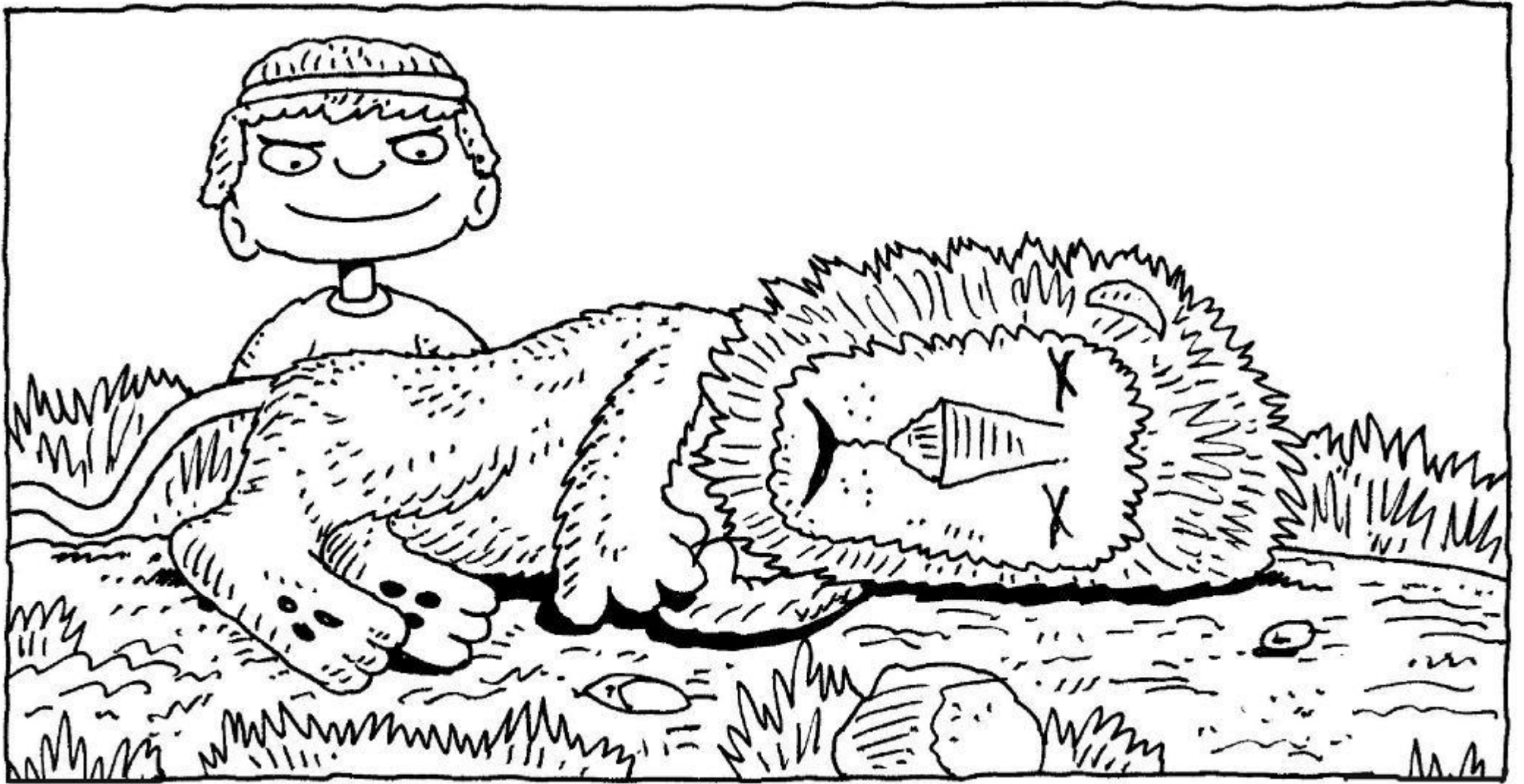
David was a good shepherd boy.

“That one hit the mark!”



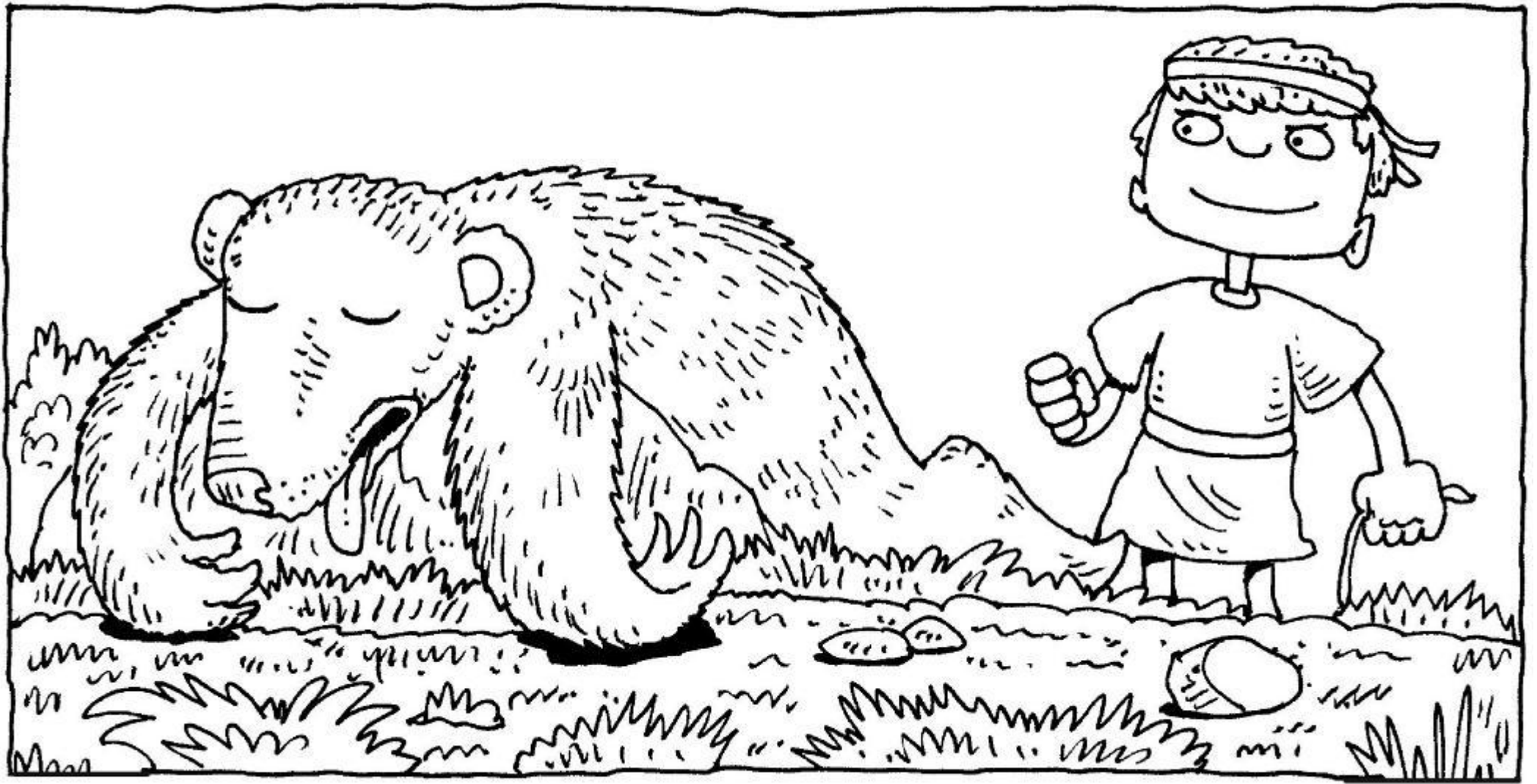
One day David saw a hungry lion.

He tried to scare the lion.



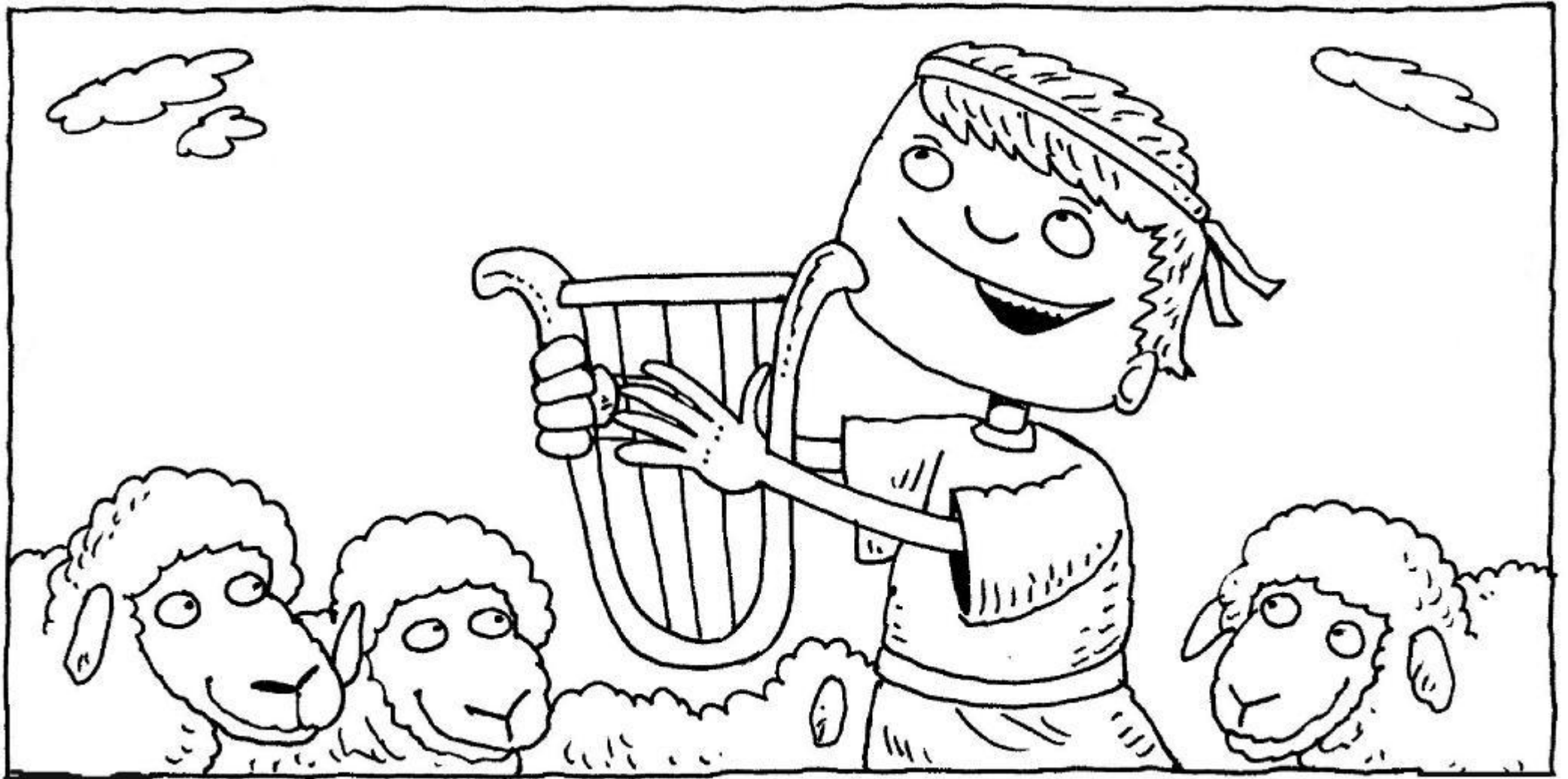
Then he put a stone in his sling,
