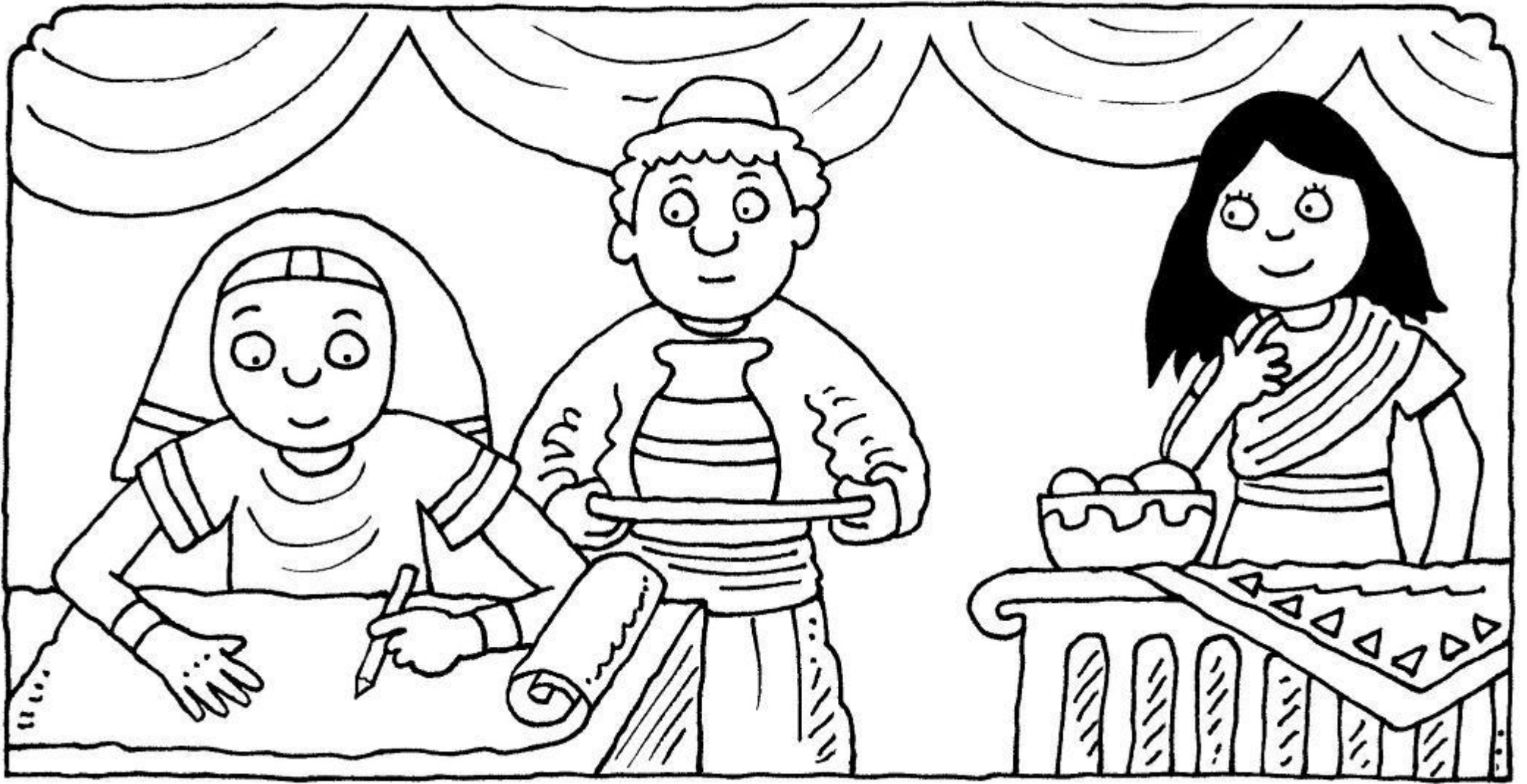


JOSEPH AND POTIPHAR'S WIFE

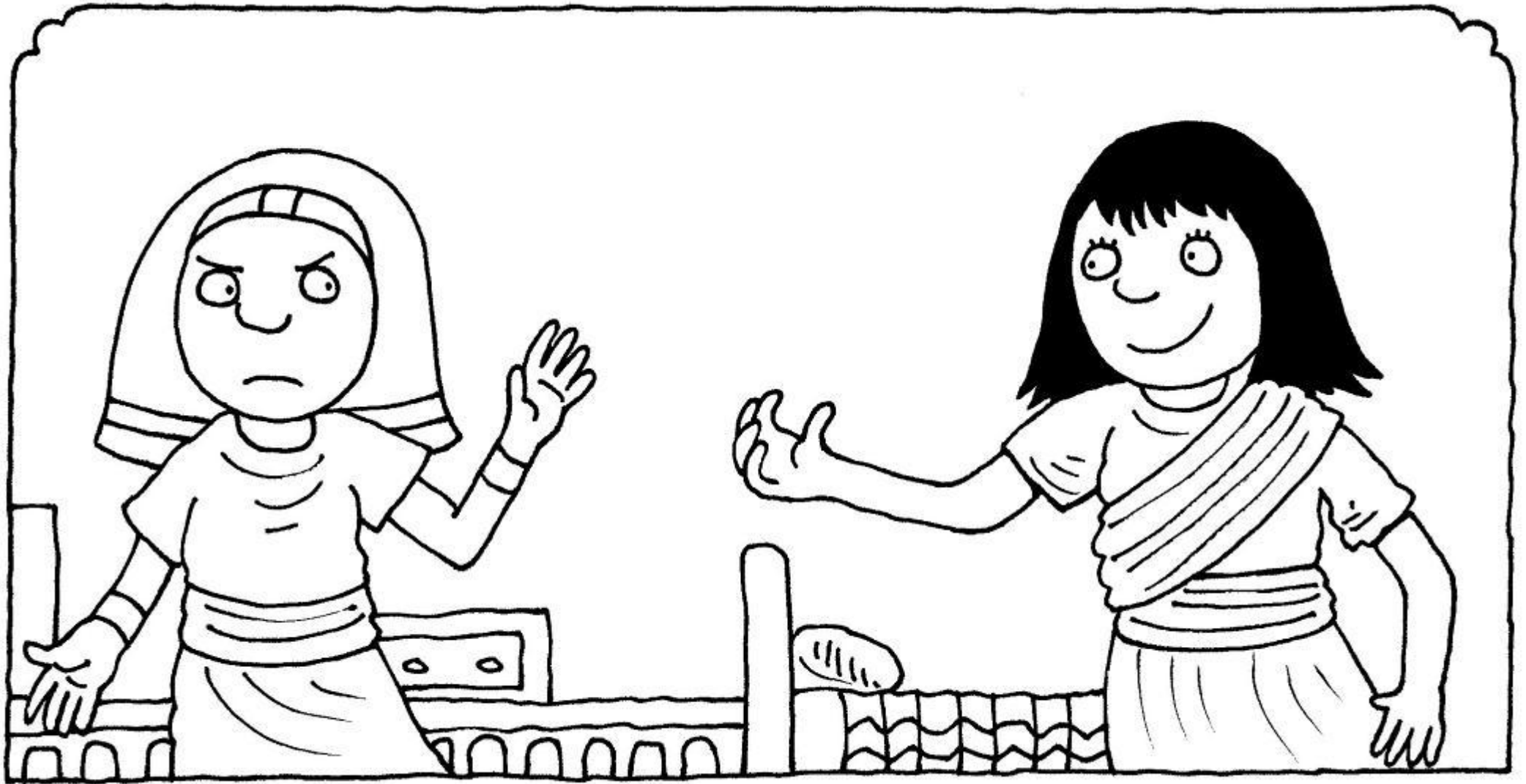

In the land of Egypt, Potiphar was a very important man. He was the Captain of the soldiers who guarded King Pharaoh.



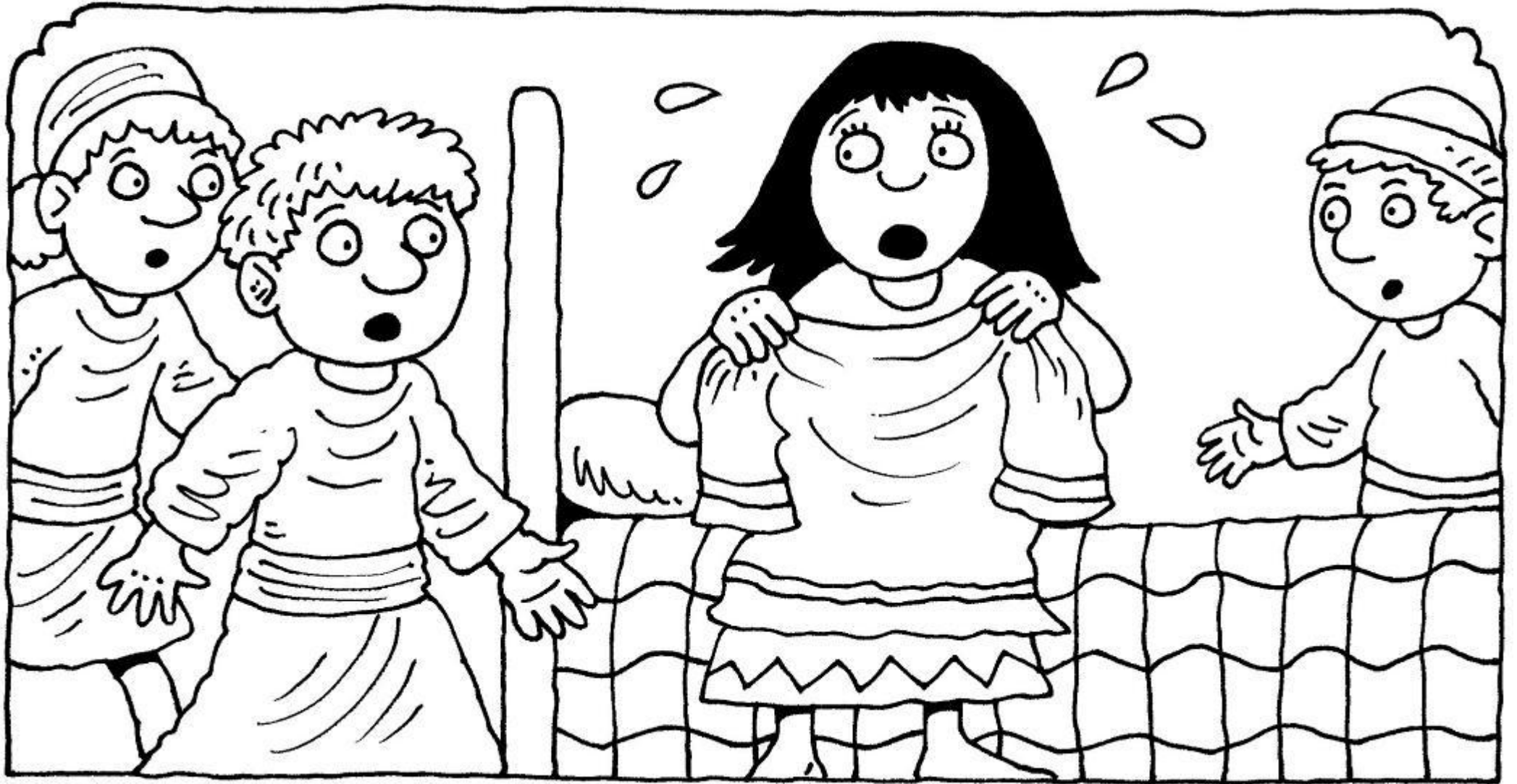
