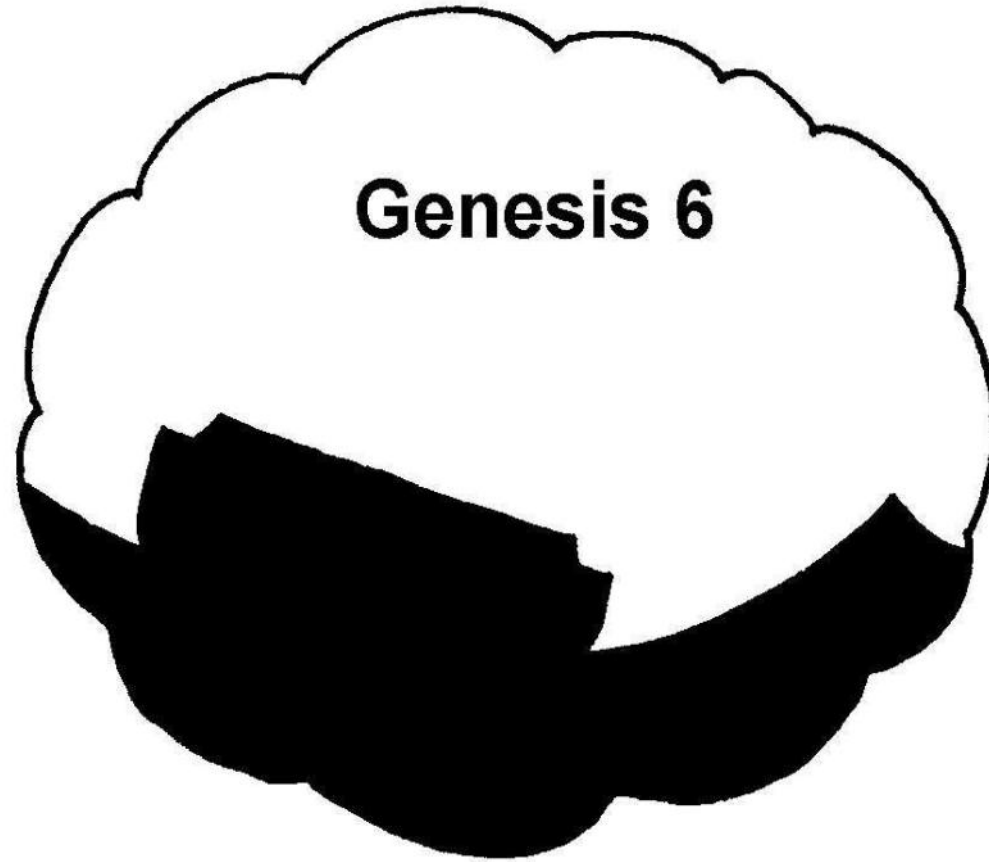
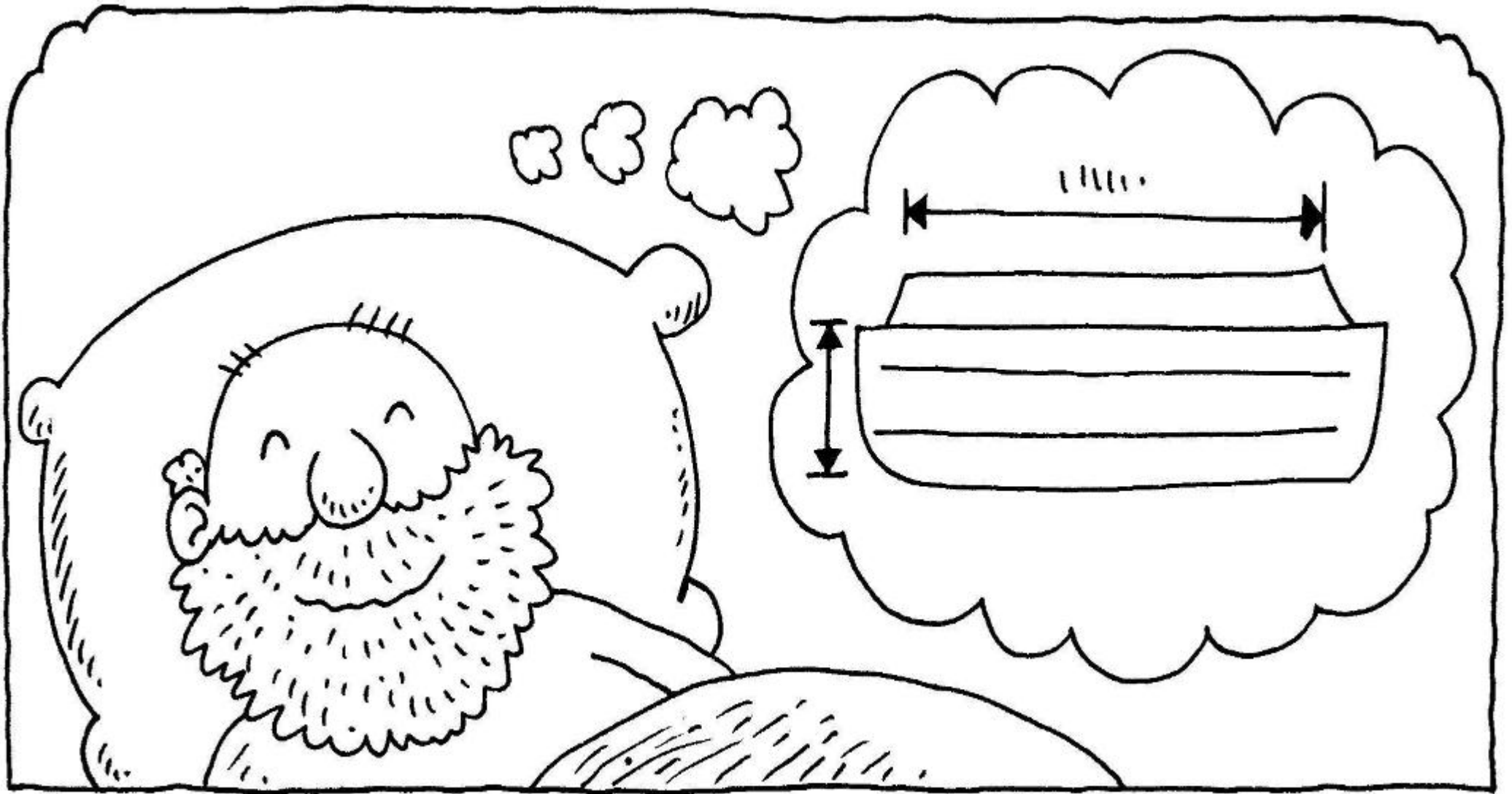


Noah And The Amazing Ark

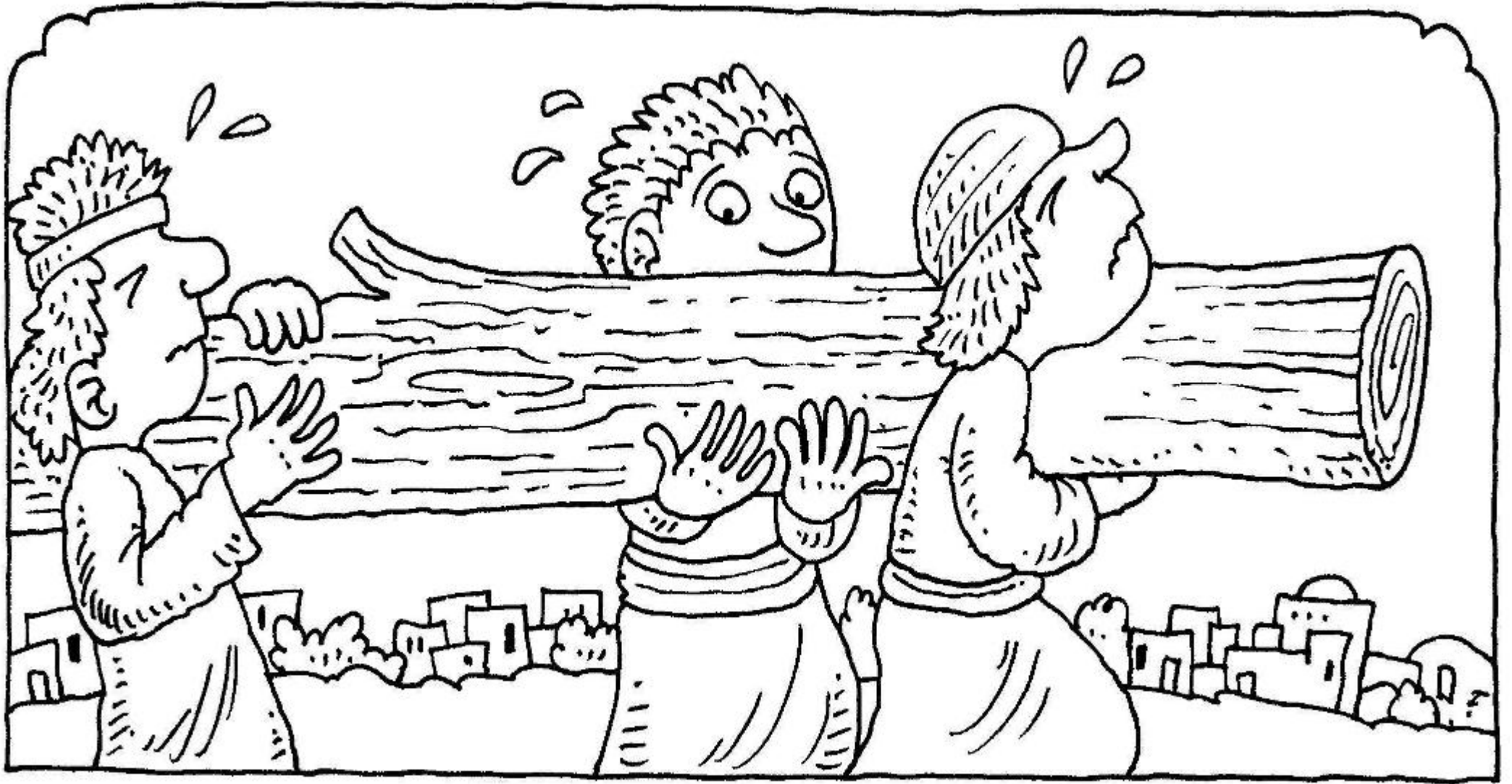
God told Noah to build a big boat,

He told him exactly how big to build it.



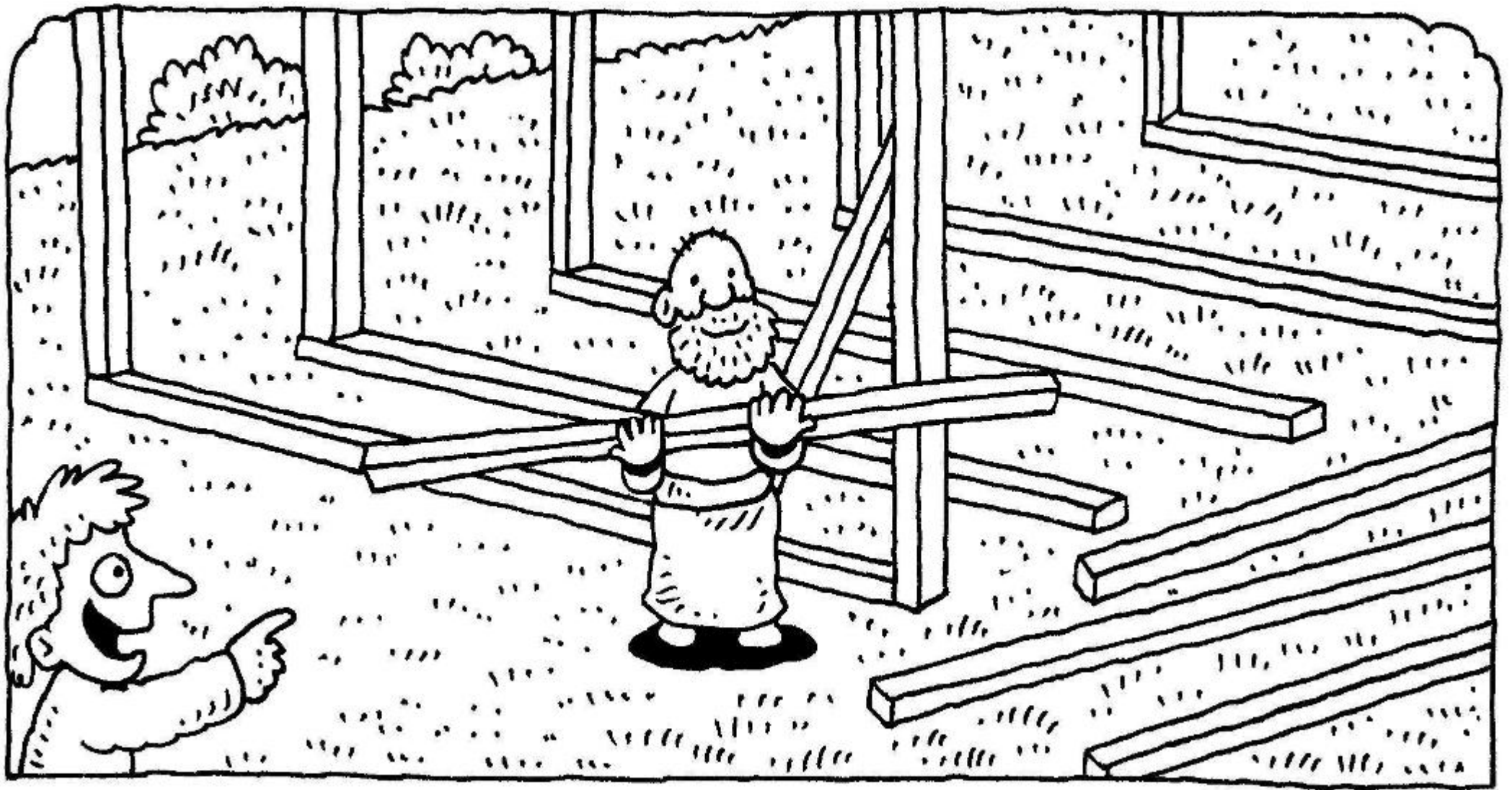
It was God's plan to save

of all the animals and birds.



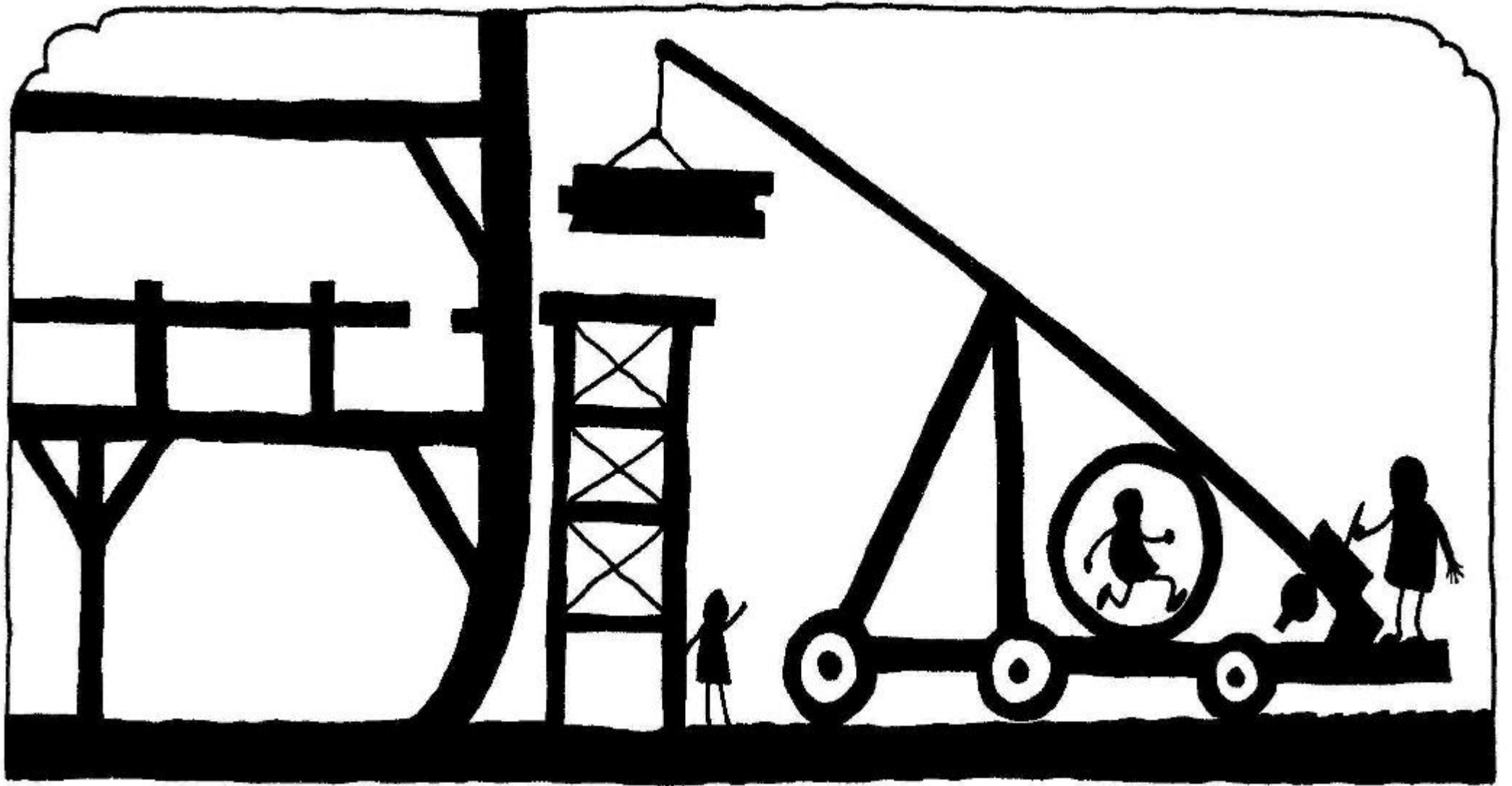
Noah trusted and obeyed God

He told them about God's plan to save them.



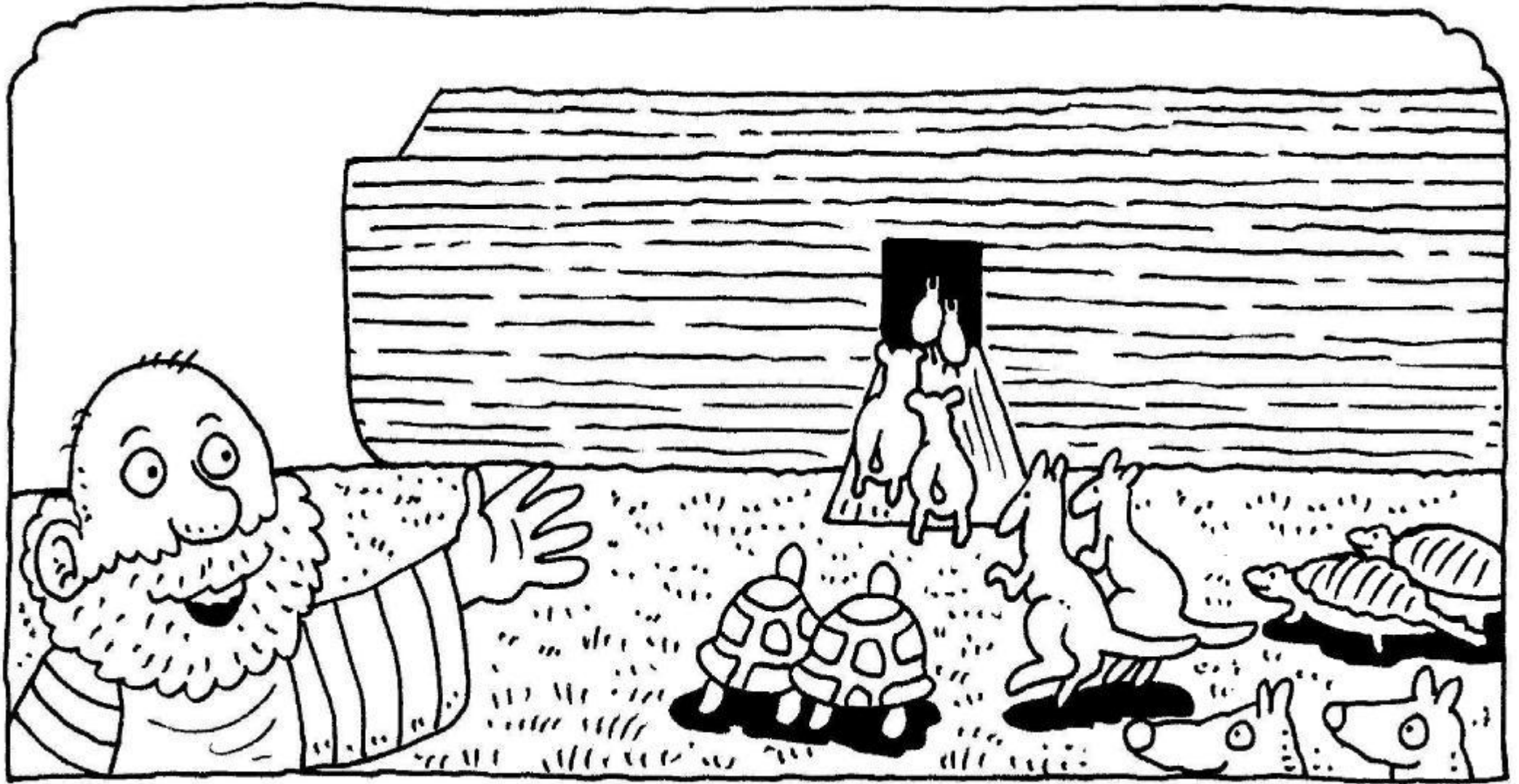
Noah's sons worked hard helping their father to get enough logs of Gopher wood to build the amazing boat.
