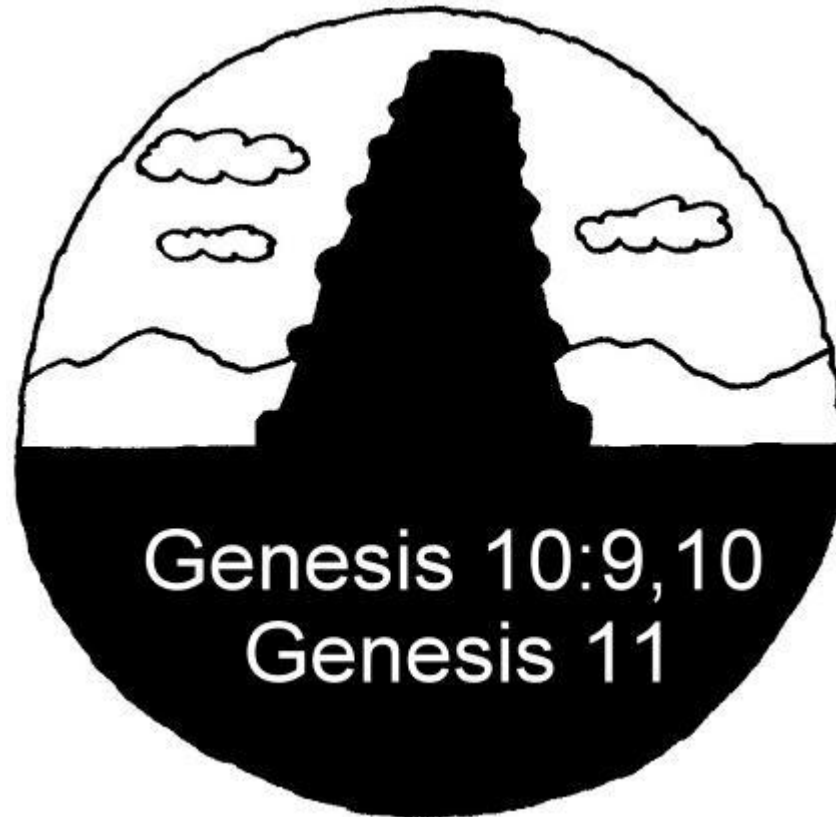


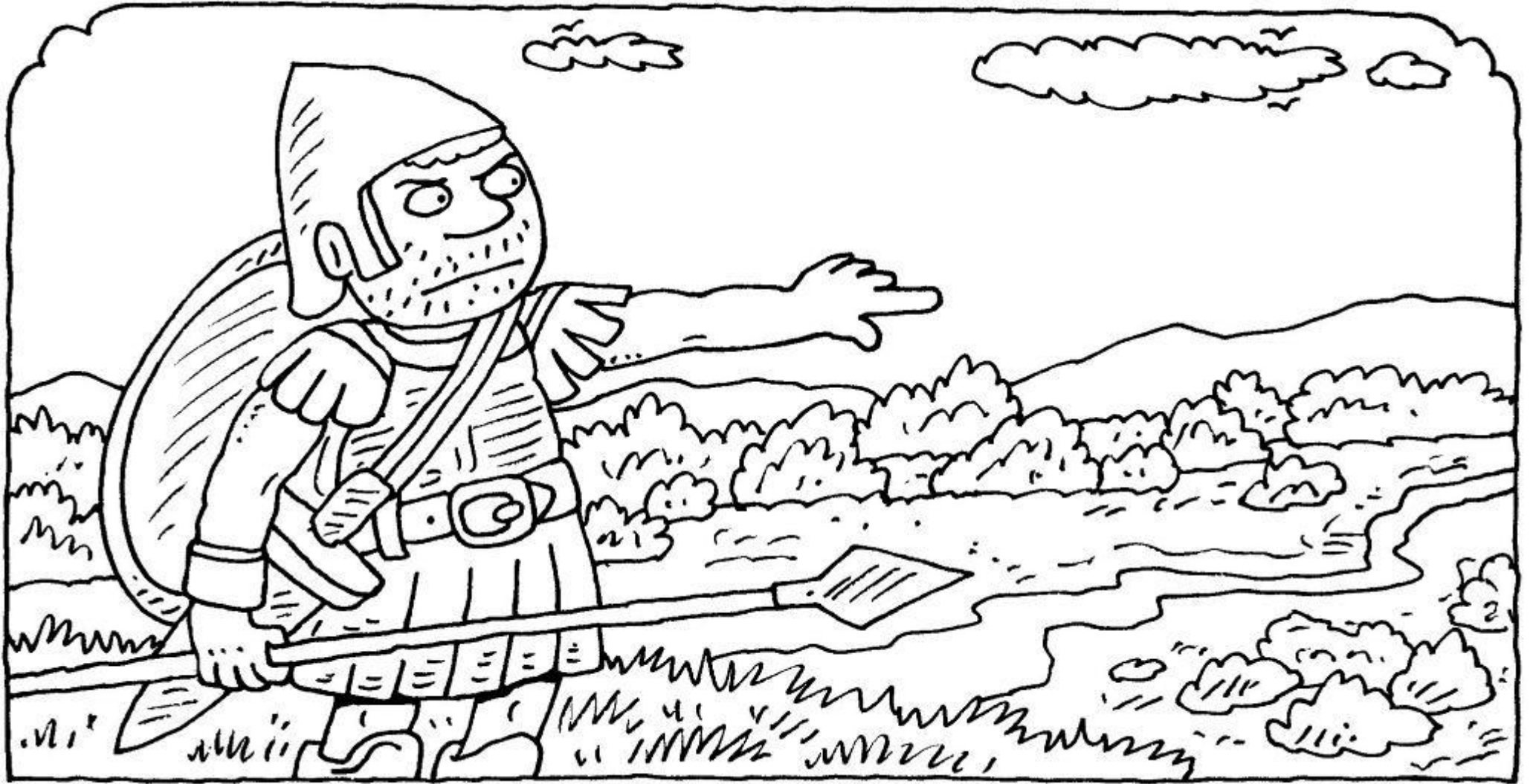
THE TOWER OF BABEL

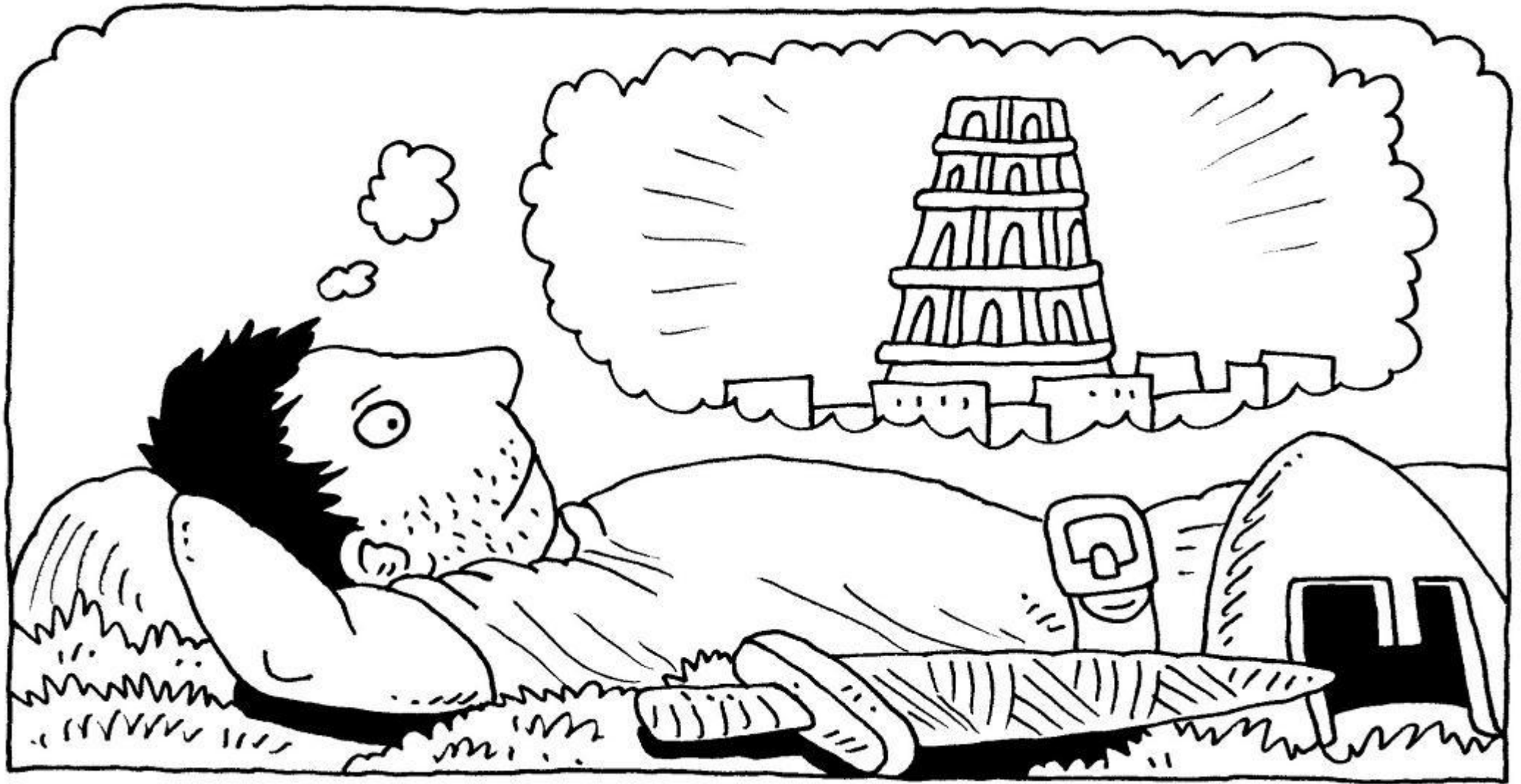

Nimrod the mighty hunter was Noah's great grandson and the leader of his family. They all spoke the same language.



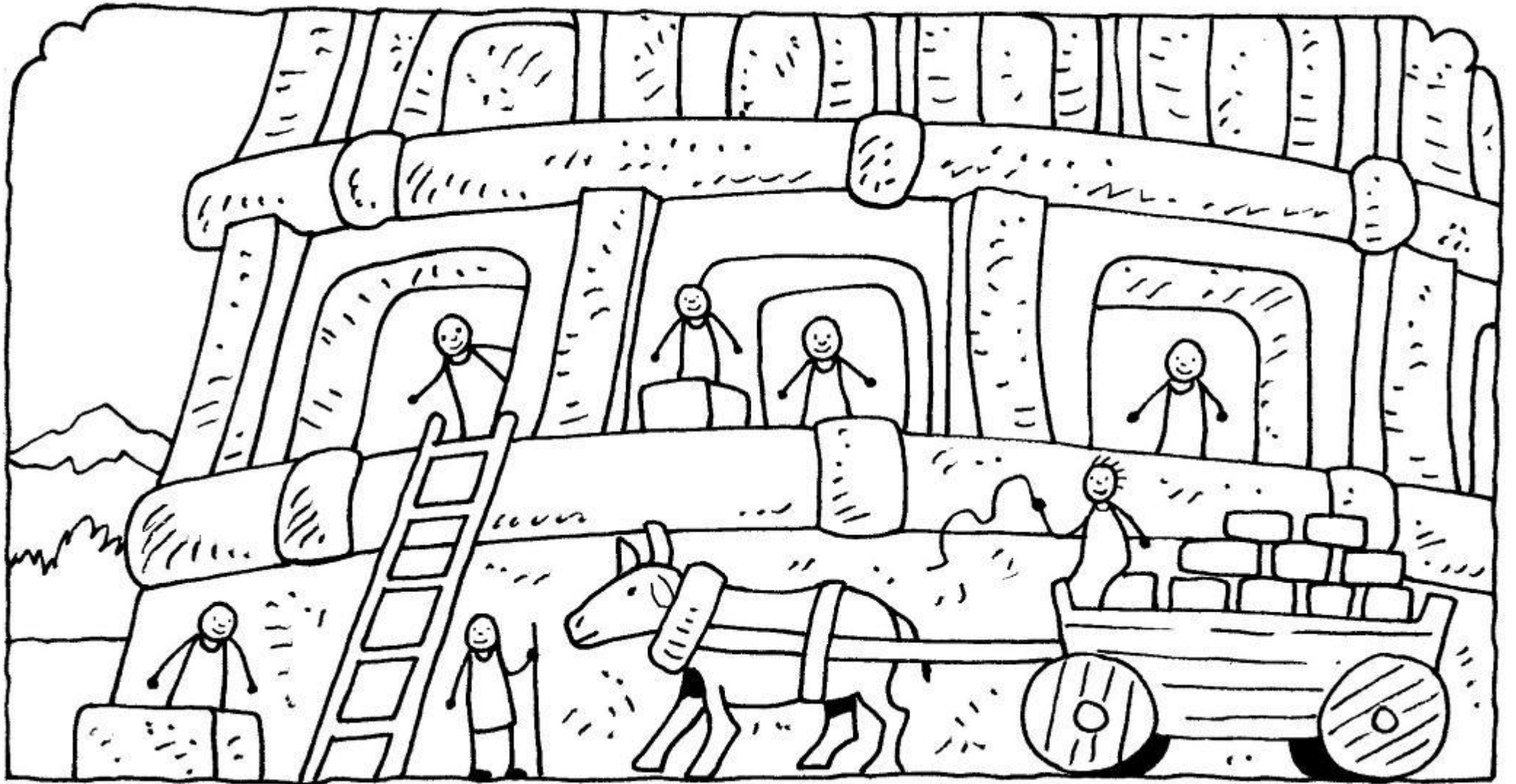

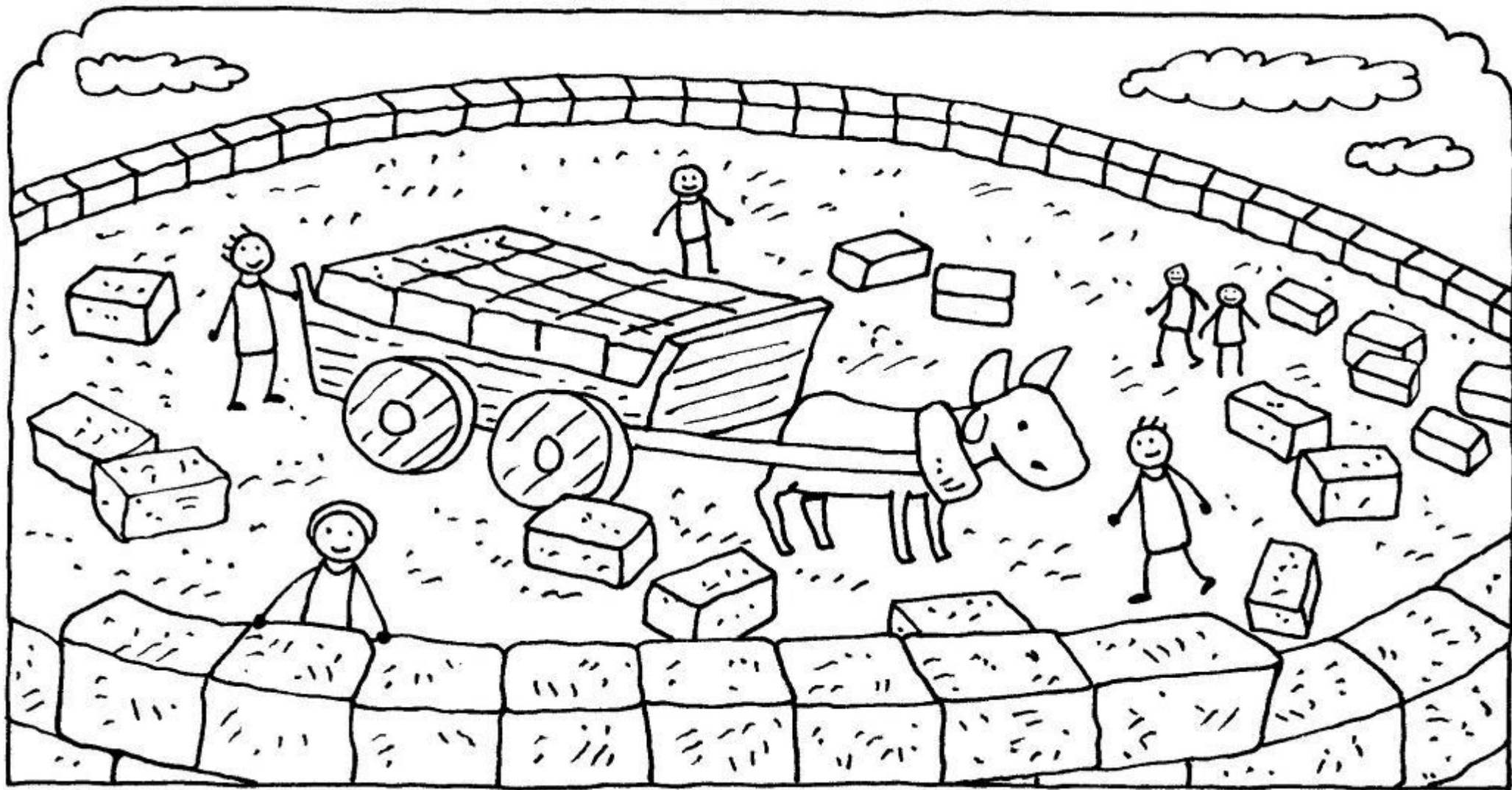
He lay awake at night thinking about his tower.

The tower would fall over if he built it too high.



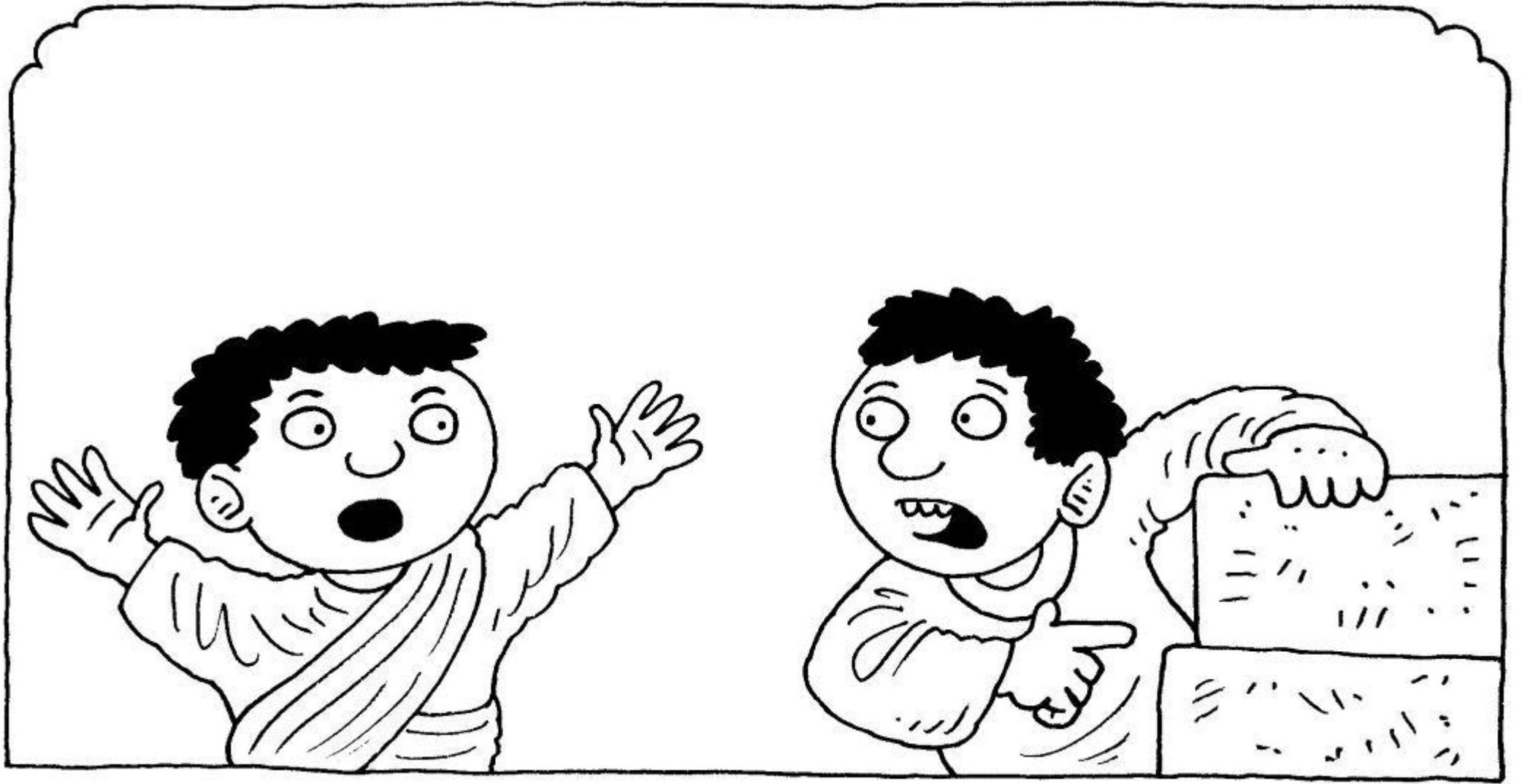
He had an idea! Instead of using round stones, he made flat bricks, drying them in a fire until they were hard and strong. With a good foundation he could build higher than anyone had ever done!
