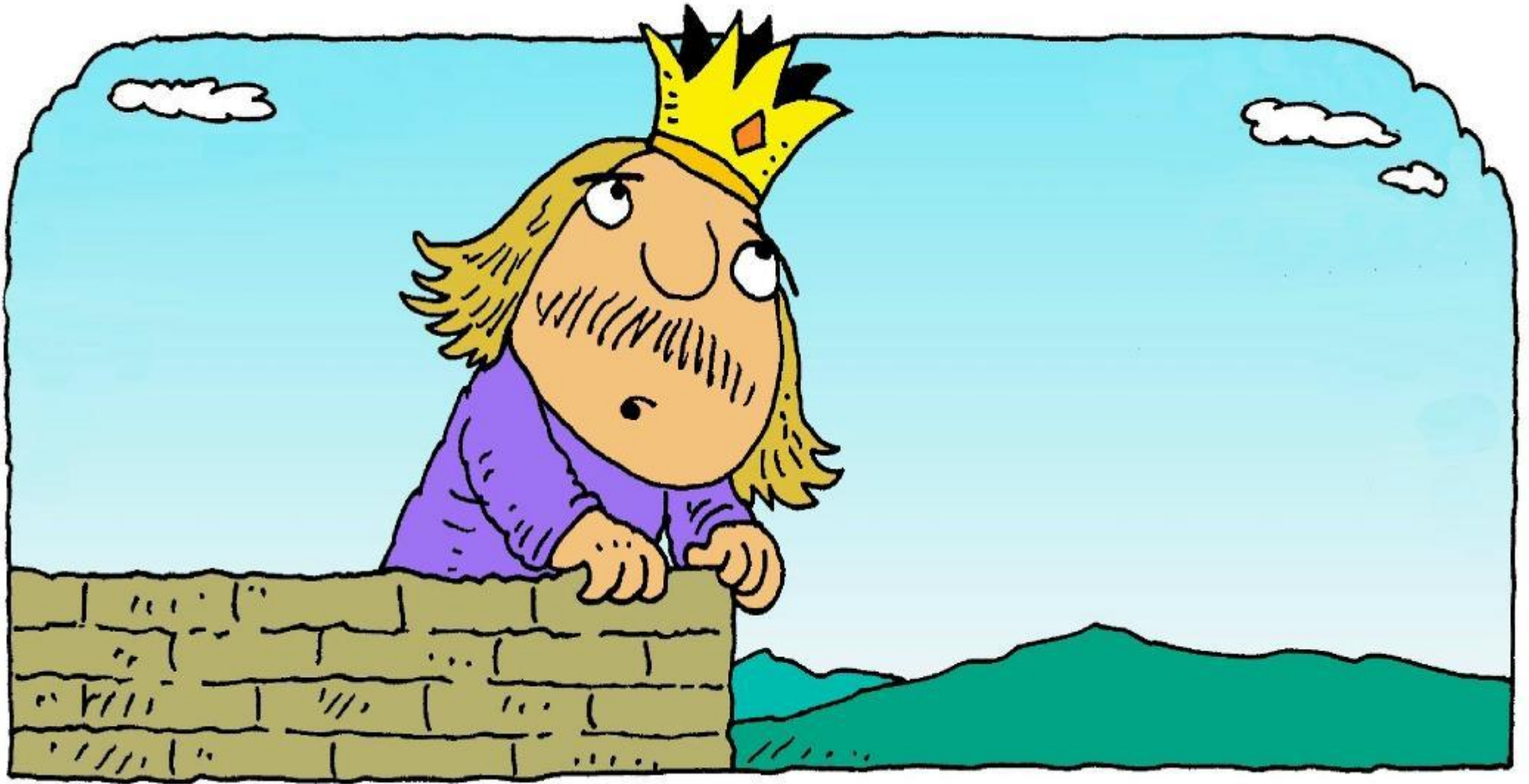

A long time ago in Babylon there lived a very proud king called Nebuchadnezzar. "I am great. I made myself great and I don't need God at all," he said proudly.

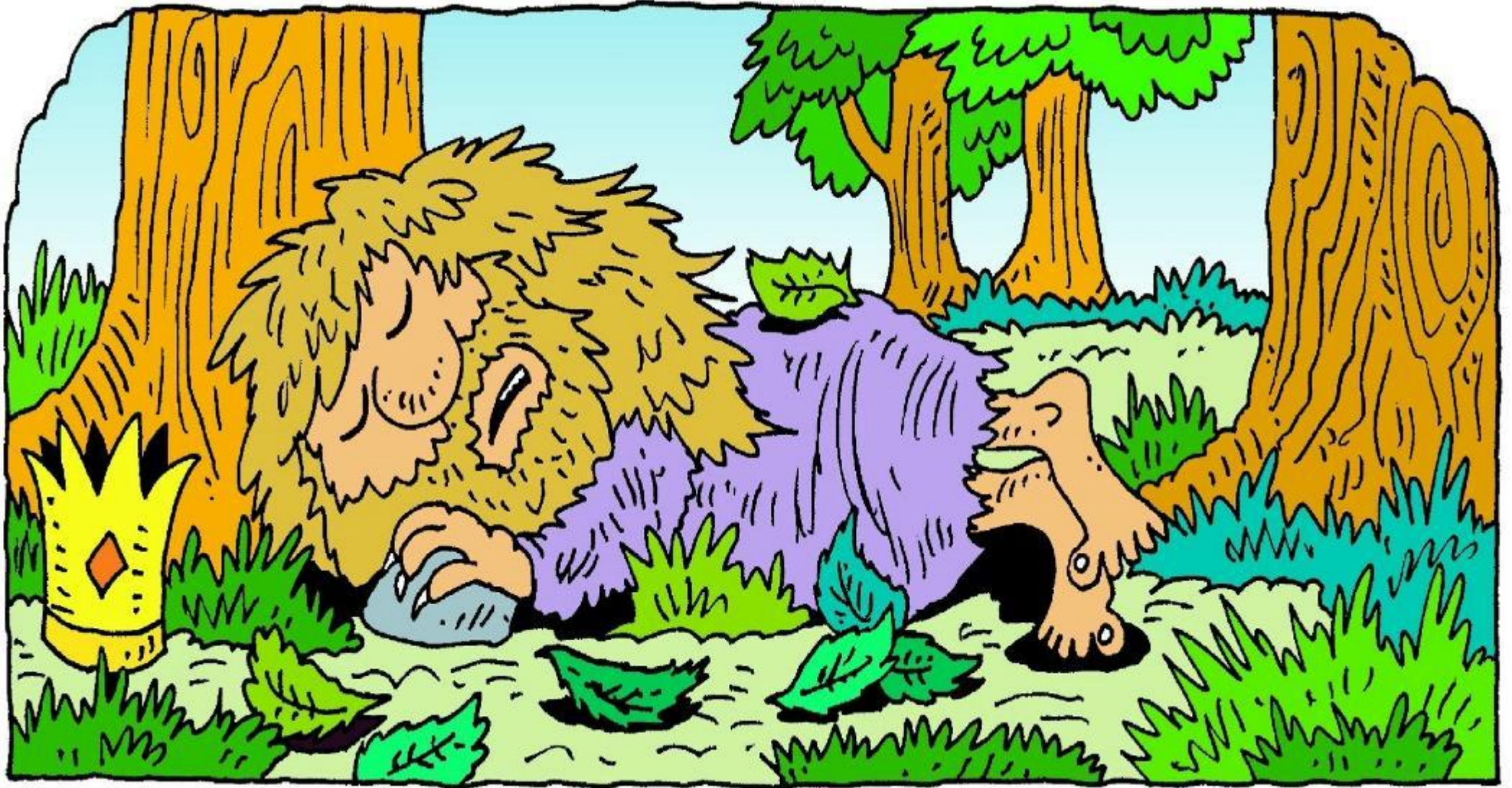


God was not pleased with this very proud King who thought he didn't need him.

“You will spend some time living like an animal!” said God.



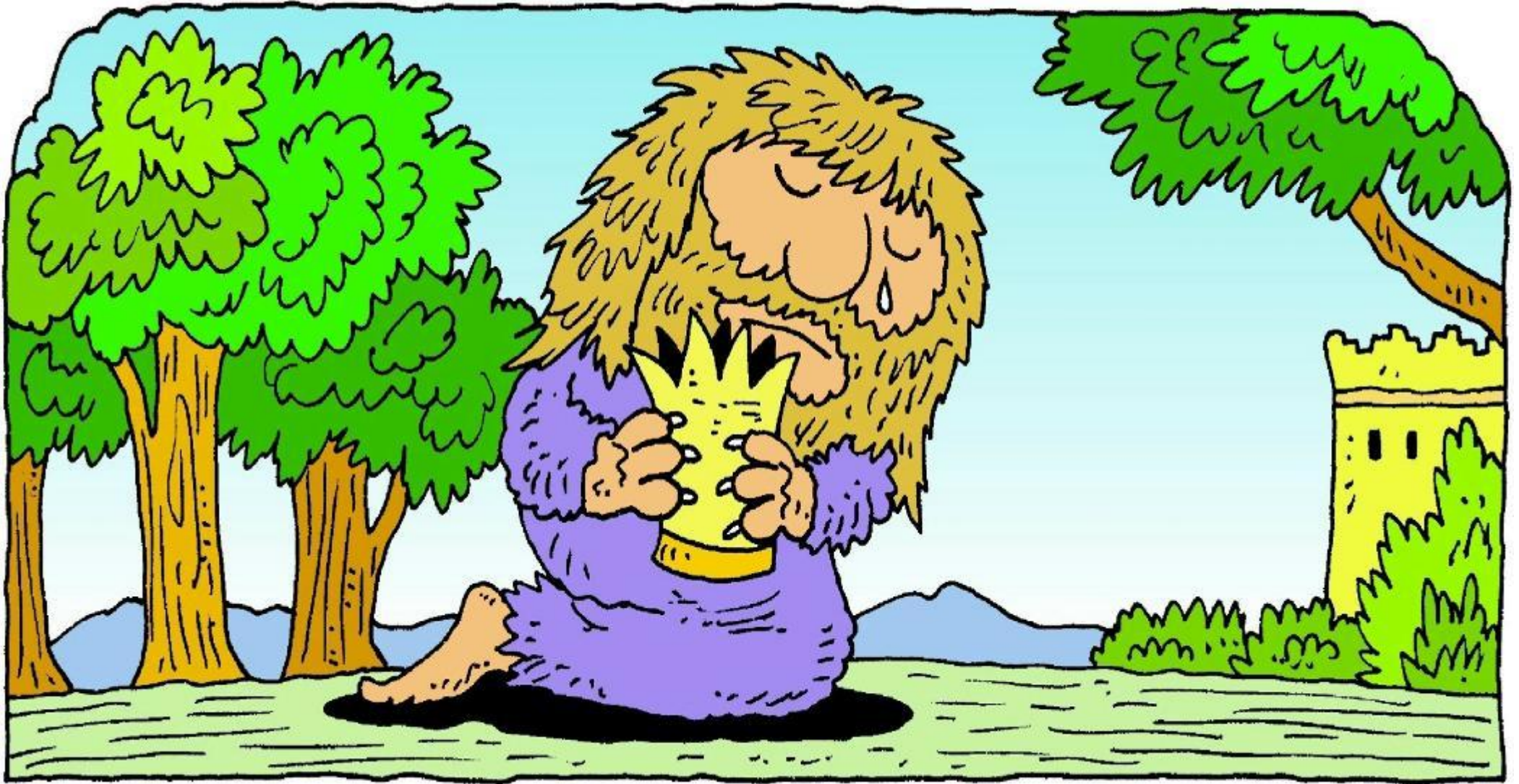
King Nebuchadnezzar started to change how he behaved. He went outside his palace and lived like an animal.
