

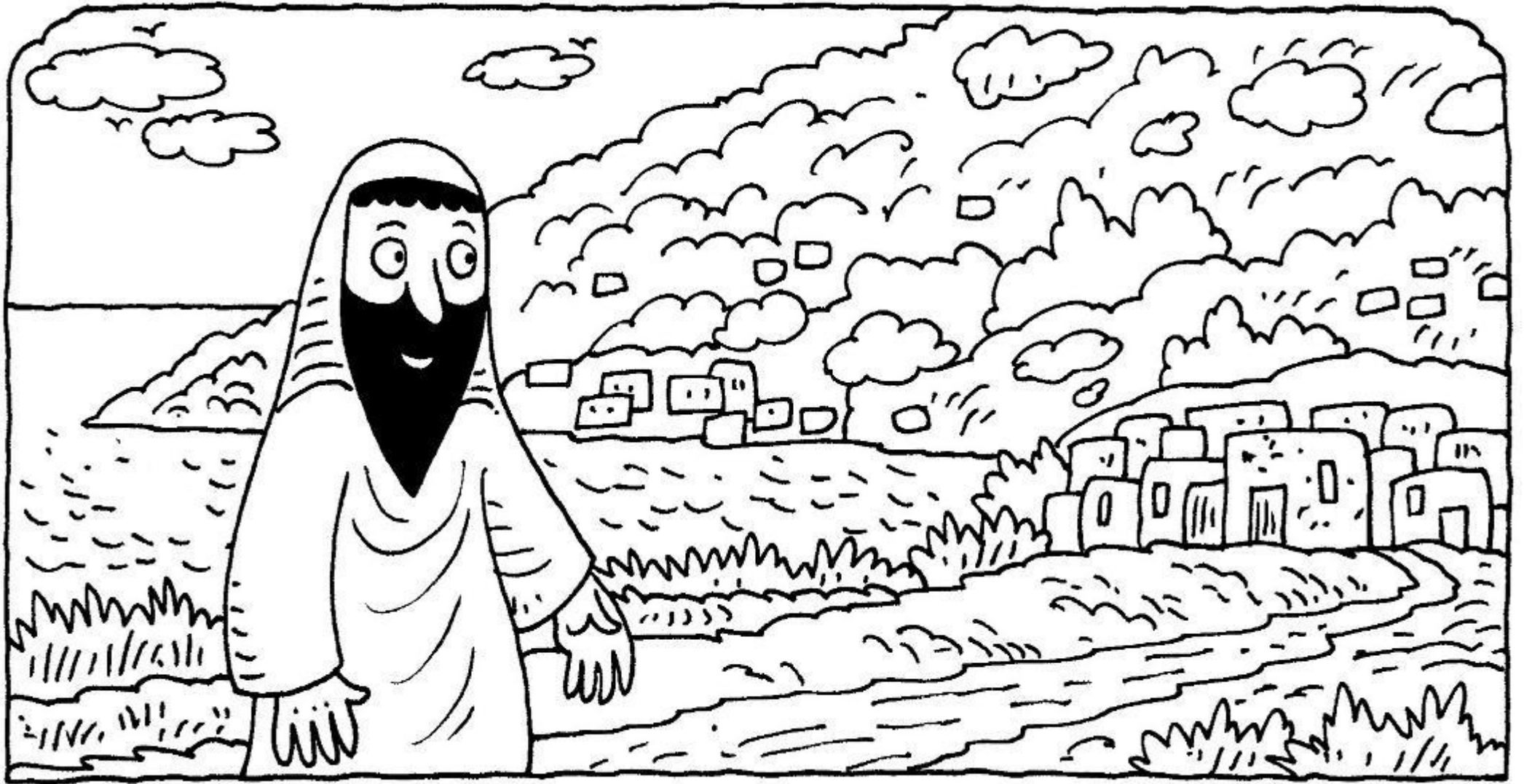
Jesus Heals The Man's Ears and Tongue

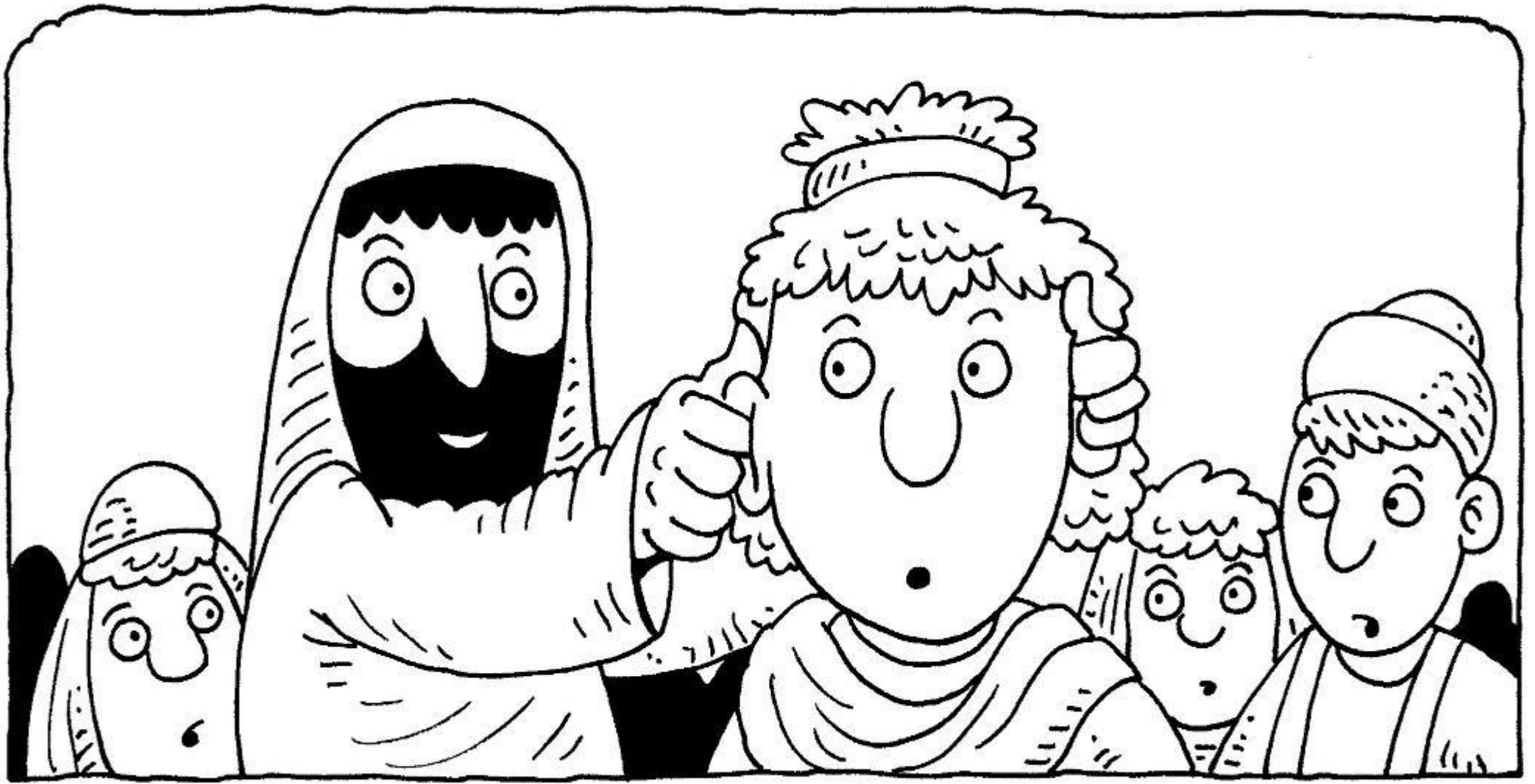
There was a man in Galilee who could not hear. No one could understand him, either, because he couldn't form sounds with his tongue. It could not move much.
