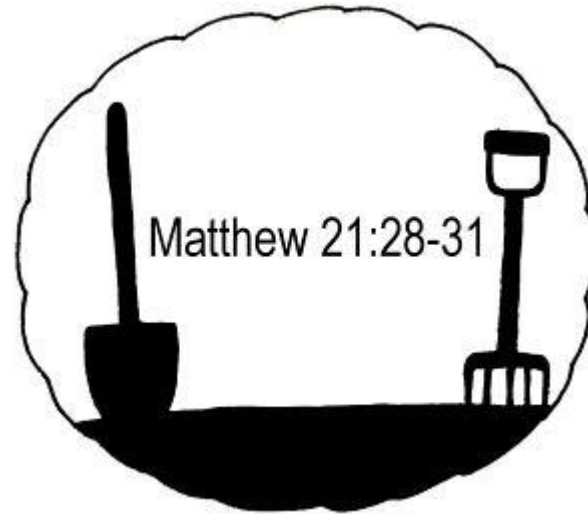


Parable: Doing The Father's Will

for God will be rewarded one day.



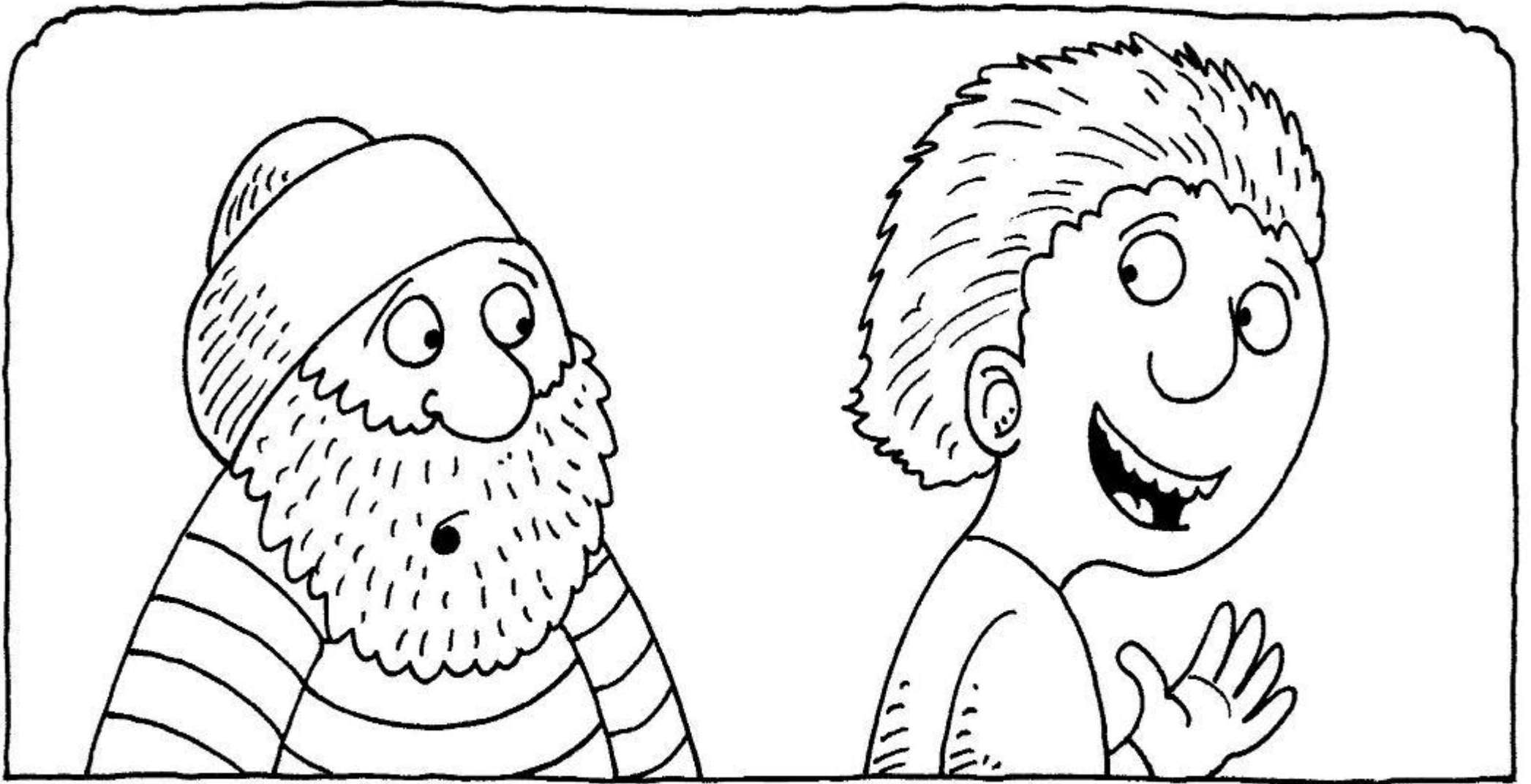
Jesus was teaching about God's love to crowds of people from all walks of life. Some of them were living lives that were not good and needed to turn back to God.



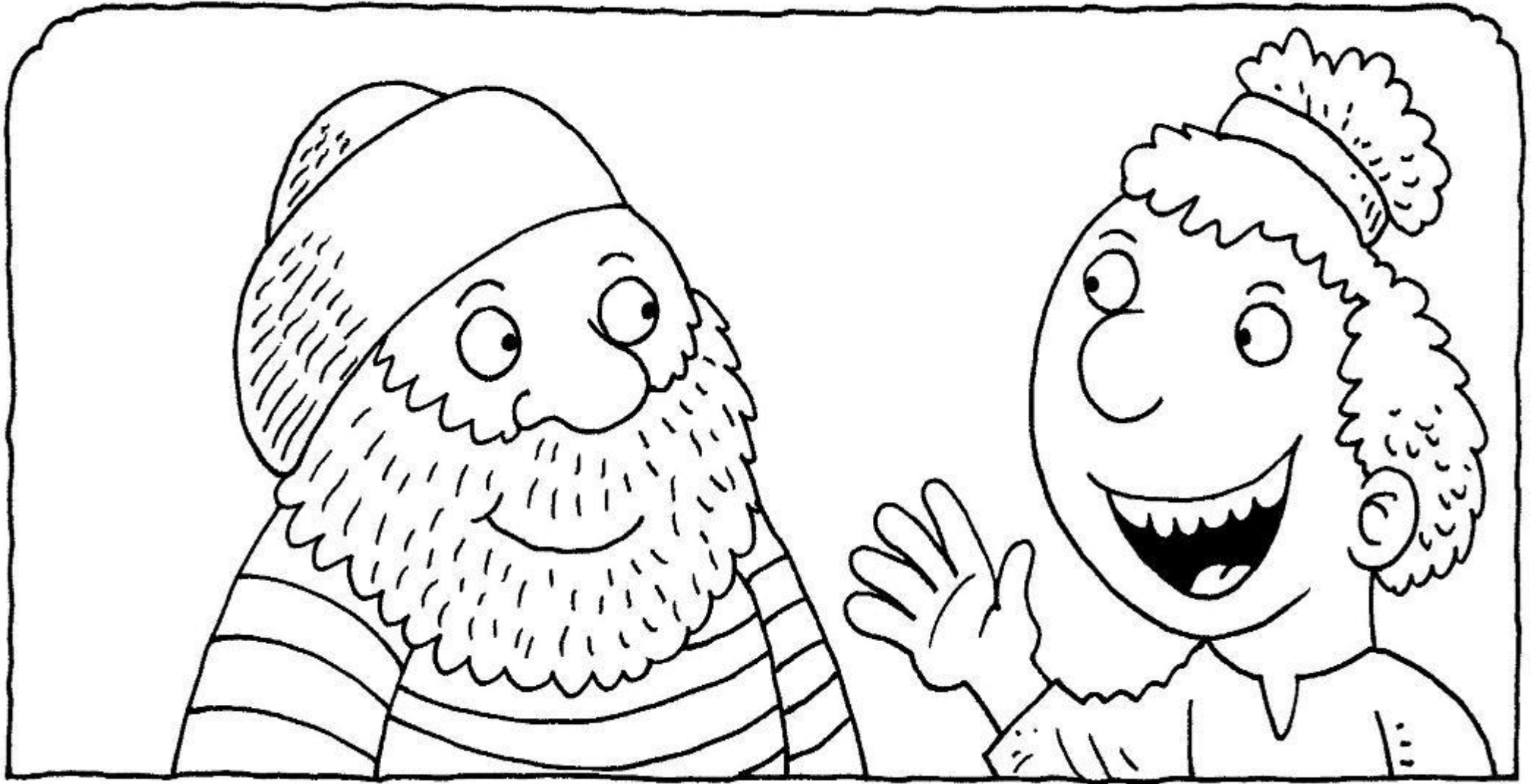
The Chief priest and temple teachers thought that Jesus shouldn't be friends with bad people and asked Jesus where he got the authority to teach and preach?



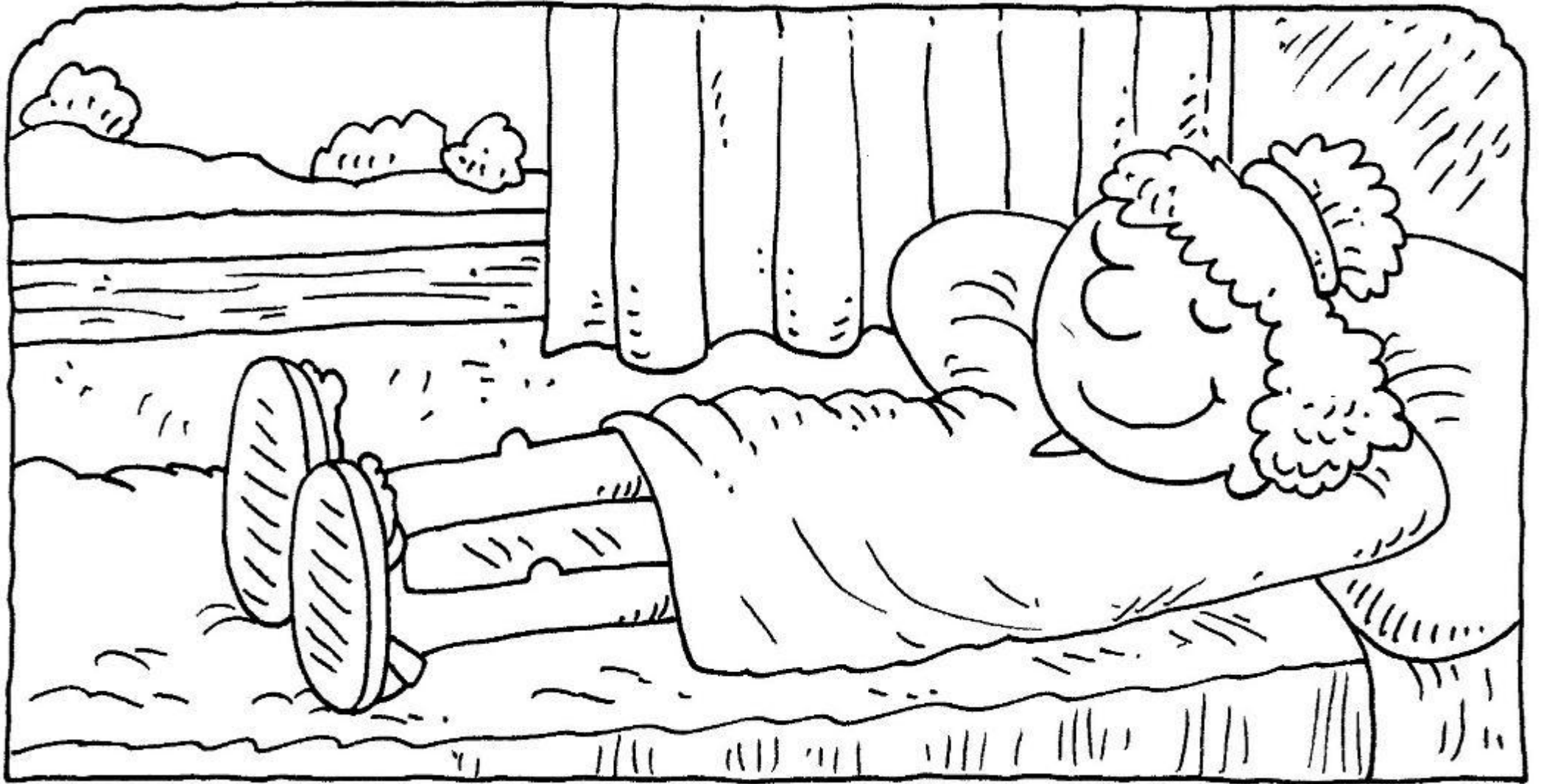
Jesus said, “The owner of a vineyard had two sons. There was much work to be done pruning vines, picking grapes and making wine.
